- *A person or institution regarded as interfering and overprotective.*
- *A female goat.*

Synonyms of "Nanny" as a noun (7 Words)

au pair	Two items of the same kind.
governess	(especially in former times) a woman employed to teach children in a private household.
nanny-goat	Female goat.
nurse	A wet nurse. <i>Her mother s old nurse.</i>
nursemaid	A woman who is the custodian of children.
nursery nurse	A child's room for a baby.
she-goat	Female goat.

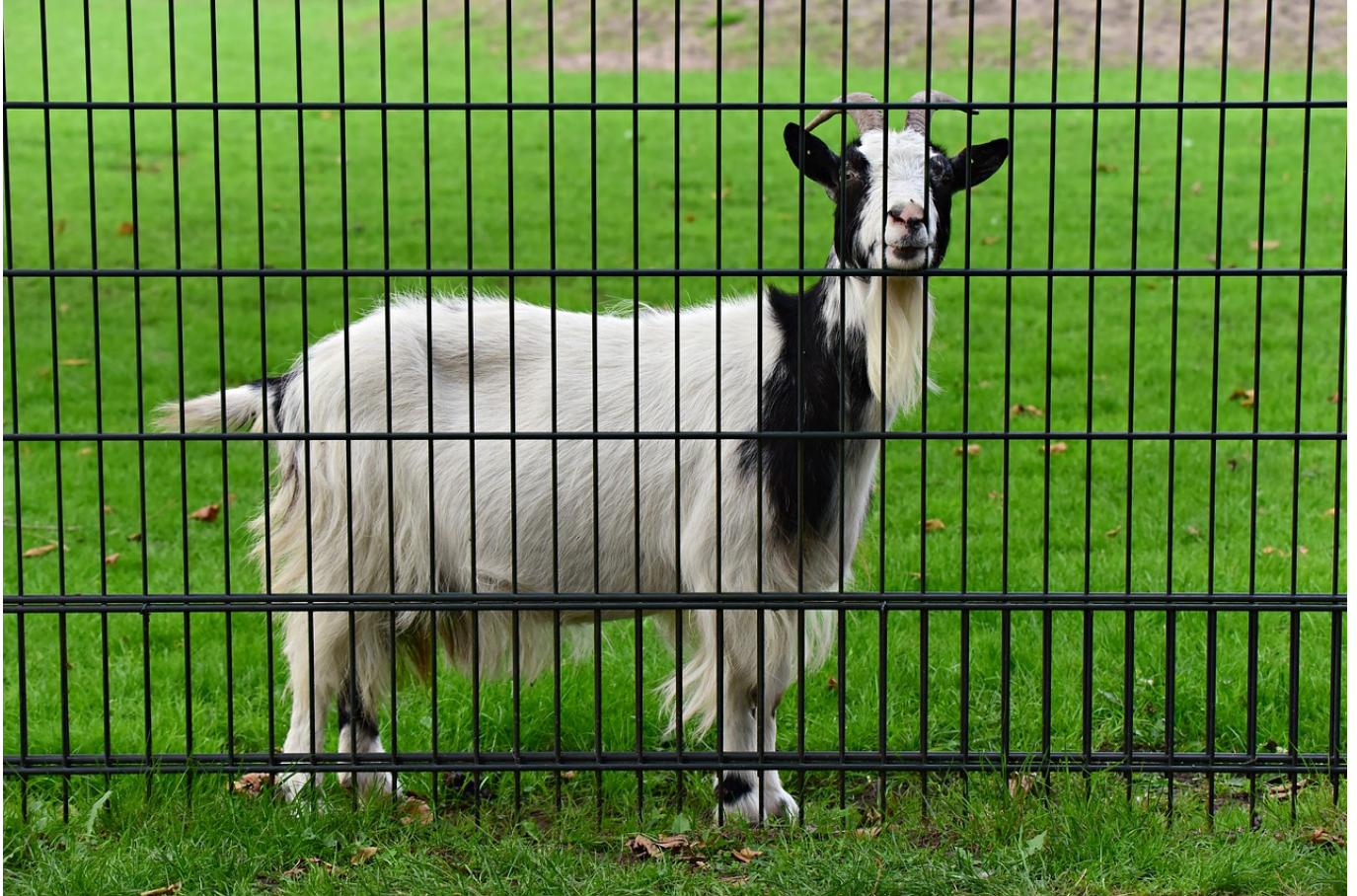


Nanny as a Verb

Definitions of "Nanny" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "nanny" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Be overprotective towards.*
- *Work as a nanny.*



Synonyms of "Nanny" as a verb (7 Words)

baby	Treat someone as a baby pamper or be overprotective towards. <i>Her aunt babied her and fussed over her clothes.</i>
be overprotective towards	Be priced at.
<u>coddle</u>	Treat with excessive indulgence. <i>Let s not mollycoddle our students.</i>
cosset	Care for and protect in an overindulgent way. <i>All her life she d been cosseted by her family.</i>
mollycoddle	Treat (someone) in an indulgent or overprotective way. <i>Let s not mollycoddle our students.</i>
nursemaid	Look after or be overprotective towards. <i>I haven t got time to nursemaid you through these problems.</i>
wait on hand and foot	Serve as a waiter or waitress in a restaurant.



Usage Examples of "Nanny" as a verb

- *Stop nanning us! We are capable of dealing with our own lives.*
- *She cooked, cleaned, and nannied for a family in California.*
