- *A politically organized body of people under a single government.*
- *A large body of people united by common descent, history, culture, or language, inhabiting a particular country or territory.*

The entire structure of an organism (an animal, plant, or human being).

A political system in which the supreme power lies in a body of citizens who can elect people to represent them.

The act of forming an alliance or confederation.

*Canada became a **confederation** in 1867.*

The people who live in a nation or country.

*A tract of wild **country**.*

domain

A specified sphere of activity or knowledge.

*His **domain** extended into Europe.*

<u>empire</u>	An extensive sphere of activity controlled by one person or group. <i>Each ministry each department had its own empire its own agenda and worked to protect its turf.</i>
ethnic group	A person who is a member of an ethnic group.
ethnic minority	A person who is a member of an ethnic group.
<u>federation</u>	An organization or group within which smaller divisions have some degree of internal autonomy. <i>A first step in the federation of Europe.</i>
<u>kingdom</u>	The highest taxonomic group into which organisms are grouped; one of five biological categories: Monera or Protocista or Plantae or Fungi or Animalia. <i>The kingdom of dreams.</i>
land	Extensive landed property especially in the country retained by the owner for his own use. <i>Many people are leaving the land and going to work in the city.</i>
nation state	A politically organized body of people under a single government.
polity	An organized society; a state as a political entity. <i>The civic humanist s polity.</i>
power	Holding an office means being in power. <i>Gay power.</i>
race	A series of races for horses or dogs held at a fixed time on a set course. <i>The race for the presidency.</i>
<u>republic</u>	A political system in which the supreme power lies in a body of citizens who can elect people to represent them. <i>The head of state in a republic is usually a president.</i>
res publica	A politically organized body of people under a single government.
sovereign state	A nation's ruler or head of state usually by hereditary right.
state	The group of people comprising the government of a sovereign state. <i>The state of the company s finances.</i>
superpower	A very powerful and influential nation (used especially with reference to the US and the former Soviet Union when these were perceived as the two most powerful nations in the world). <i>The threat to oil supplies brought the two superpowers closer together.</i>

tribe

A social division of (usually preliterate) people.
*She made a stand against the social codes of her English middle class **tribe**.*

Associations of "Nation" (30 Words)

<u>ambassador</u>	An accredited diplomat sent by a state as its permanent representative in a foreign country. <i>The French ambassador to Portugal.</i>
consul	A diplomat appointed by a government to protect its commercial interests and help its citizens in a foreign country. <i>The British consul in Israel.</i>
<u>country</u>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The airfield is right out in the country.</i>
diplomat	A person who can deal with others in a sensitive and tactful way.
diplomatic	Relating to or characteristic of diplomacy. <i>Diplomatic relations with Britain were broken.</i>
<u>dynasty</u>	A line of hereditary rulers of a country. <i>The Tang dynasty.</i>

embassy	The staff working in an embassy. <i>Worsley failed to be selected to join the embassy to Sweden.</i>
emperor	Large richly colored butterfly. <i>He is regarded as one of the greatest Roman emperors.</i>
envoy	A minister plenipotentiary, ranking below ambassador and above chargé d'affaires. <i>The UN special envoy to Yugoslavia.</i>
foreign	Strange and unfamiliar. <i>A man with a foreign accent.</i>
govern	Bring into conformity with rules or principles or usage; impose regulations. <i>He was incapable of governing the country.</i>
imperial	A piece of luggage carried on top of a coach. <i>Golden age of imperial splendor.</i>
jingoism	An appeal intended to arouse patriotic emotions. <i>The popular jingoism that swept the lower middle classes.</i>
kingdom	Each of the three traditional divisions (animal, vegetable, and mineral) in which natural objects have conventionally been classified. <i>The untroubled kingdom of reason.</i>
liege	A vassal or subject. <i>A liege subject.</i>
lord	Make a lord of someone. <i>When we were at school you used to lord it over us.</i>
nationalism	Advocacy of or support for the political independence of a particular nation or people. <i>British nationalism was in the air and patriotic sentiments ran high.</i>
nationalist	Relating to nationalists or nationalism. <i>A Basque nationalist.</i>
nobleman	A man who belongs by rank, title, or birth to the aristocracy; a peer.
patrician	A person of refined upbringing and manners. <i>A proud patrician face.</i>
patriot	A person who vigorously supports their country and is prepared to defend it against enemies or detractors. <i>A true patriot.</i>
patriotic	Having or expressing devotion to and vigorous support for one's country. <i>Today's game will be played before a fiercely patriotic crowd.</i>

patriotism	The quality of being patriotic; devotion to and vigorous support for one's country. <i>A highly decorated officer of unquestionable integrity and patriotism.</i> (of power) absolute.
plenipotentiary	<i>He went armed with plenipotentiary powers to take whatever measures he felt necessary.</i>
politics	The activities associated with the governance of a country or area, especially the debate between parties having power. <i>Government agencies multiplied beyond the control of representative politics.</i>
principality	A state ruled by a prince.
regal	Belonging to or befitting a supreme ruler. <i>Her regal bearing.</i>
regency	The particular period of a regency especially in Britain from 1811 to 1820 and in France from 1715 to 1723. <i>The boy being a minor there would have to be a regency.</i>
royal	A sail set next above the topgallant on a royal mast. <i>Contributors included members of the royal family.</i>
statesman	A man who is a respected leader in national or international affairs. <i>Guests included members of the European royal families, diplomats, and statesmen.</i>
