<u>citizen</u>	An inhabitant of a particular town or city. A British citizen .
inhabitant	A person who fulfils the residential or legal requirements for being a member of a state or parish.
<u>native</u>	An indigenous person who was born in a particular place. New York in the summer was too hot even for the native s.
resident	A physician (especially an intern) who lives in a hospital and cares for hospitalized patients under the supervision of the medical staff of the hospital. <i>Arctic residents</i> are joined annually by long distance migrants.
<u>subject</u>	The subject matter of a conversation or discussion. <i>The chorale like second subject of the Scherzo.</i>

Definitions of "National" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "national" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Concerned with or applicable to or belonging to an entire nation or country.
- Of or relating to or belonging to a nation or country.
- Owned, controlled, or financially supported by the state.
- Limited to or in the interests of a particular nation.
- Owned or maintained for the public by the national government.
- Characteristic of or peculiar to the people of a nation.
- Inside the country.
- Relating to or characteristic of a nation; common to a whole nation.
- Of or relating to nationality.





Synonyms of "National" as an adjective (12 Words)

comprehensive	Of large content or scope; wide-ranging. A comprehensive collection of photographs.
countrywide	Occurring or extending throughout a country or nation. A countrywide tour.
federal	Of or relating to the central government of a federation. A federal system like that of the United States.
<u>general</u>	Prevailing among and common to the general public. Bearing a general resemblance to the original.
governmental	Relating to or dealing with the affairs or structure of government or politics or the state. <i>Governmental</i> intervention in the economy.
home	Made done or intended for use in the home. <i>Home</i> fans.
interior	(in filming) indoor. The layer immediately interior to the epidermis.
<u>internal</u>	Located inward. The nation s internal politics.
nationwide	Extending or reaching throughout a whole nation. A nationwide hunt.
<u>overall</u>	Taking everything into account. The overall cost.
<u>public</u>	Open to or shared by all the people of an area or country. A public library.
<u>widespread</u>	Found or distributed over a large area or number of people. <i>Widespread fear of nuclear war.</i>

Associations of "National" (30 Words)

area	A sunken enclosure giving access to the basement of a building. The spacious cooking area provided plenty of room for servants.
bicameral	Composed of two legislative bodies. The bicameral heart of a fish.
borough	One of the administrative divisions of a large city.
burgher	(in southern Africa) a civilian member of a local militia unit. The poem is not the sort of thing the sturdy burgher s of Manchester would wish to read.
<u>citizen</u>	An inhabitant of a particular town or city. A British citizen .
<u>confederation</u>	The act of forming an alliance or confederation. A confederation of trade unions.
<u>constituency</u>	The body of voters who elect a representative for their area. Most politicians are more interested in the voice of their constituency .



county	Relating to or characteristic of aristocratic people with an ancestral home in a particular county. <i>A county grande dame.</i>
disfranchise	Deprive of voting rights.
<u>dwelling</u>	Housing that someone is living in. The proposed dwelling is out of keeping with those nearby.
<u>elect</u>	Selected as the best. The members who were elect ed to the committee.
elector	In the US a member of the electoral college. Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered elector s voted.
<u>emblem</u>	A thing serving as a symbol of a particular quality or concept. <i>Our child would be a dazzling emblem of our love.</i>
enfranchise	Grant voting rights. A proposal that foreigners should be enfranchise d for local elections.
exotic	An exotic plant or animal. Protons neutrons electrons and all their exotic variants.
<u>federation</u>	A group of states with a central government but independence in internal affairs. A first step in the federation of Europe.
inhabitant	A person who fulfils the residential or legal requirements for being a member of a state or parish.
legislature	The legislative body of a country or state. <i>The Nevada state</i> legislature <i>passed a law to prohibit dumping of nuclear waste.</i>
manchester	A city in northwestern England (30 miles to the east of Liverpool); heart of the most densely populated area of England.
nationality	An ethnic group forming a part of one or more political nations. Immigrants of the same nationality often seek each other out.
parliament	(in the UK) the highest legislature, consisting of the Sovereign, the House of Lords, and the House of Commons. <i>The Russian parliament</i> .
patio	Usually paved outdoor area adjoining a residence. The dining room looks out to a small patio .
plebiscite	A vote by the electorate determining public opinion on a question of national importance. The administration will hold a plebiscite for the approval of constitutional reforms.



<u>politics</u>	The profession devoted to governing and to political affairs. The party quickly gained influence in French politics .
referendum	A general vote by the electorate on a single political question which has been referred to them for a direct decision.
<u>reside</u>	Have one's permanent home in a particular place. Legislative powers reside with the Federal Assembly.
resident	An intelligence agent in a foreign country. The film studio needed a resident historian.
sovereignty	The authority of a state to govern another state. The sovereignty of Parliament.
<u>vote</u>	Cause someone to gain or lose a particular post or honour by means of a vote. The nationalist vote in Northern Ireland.
voter	A citizen who has a legal right to vote.
