## Definitions of "National" as an adjective

- *Concerned with or applicable to or belonging to an entire nation or country.*
- *Of or relating to or belonging to a nation or country.*
- *Owned, controlled, or financially supported by the state.*
- *Limited to or in the interests of a particular nation.*
- *Owned or maintained for the public by the national government.*
- *Characteristic of or peculiar to the people of a nation.*
- *Inside the country.*
- *Relating to or characteristic of a nation; common to a whole nation.*
- *Of or relating to nationality.*

<u><a href="#">overall</a></u>	Taking everything into account. <i>The <b>overall</b> cost.</i>
<u><a href="#">public</a></u>	Open to or shared by all the people of an area or country. <i>A <b>public</b> library.</i>
<u><a href="#">widespread</a></u>	Found or distributed over a large area or number of people. <i><b>Widespread</b> fear of nuclear war.</i>

<b>borough</b>	One of the administrative divisions of a large city. (in southern Africa) a civilian member of a local militia unit.

<b>county</b>	Relating to or characteristic of aristocratic people with an ancestral home in a particular county. <i>A <b>county</b> grande dame.</i>
<b>disfranchise</b>	Deprive of voting rights.
<b><u>dwelling</u></b>	Housing that someone is living in. <i>The proposed <b>dwelling</b> is out of keeping with those nearby.</i>
<b><u>elect</u></b>	Selected as the best. <i>The members who were <b>elected</b> to the committee.</i>
<b>elector</b>	In the US a member of the electoral college. <i>Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered <b>electors</b> voted.</i>
<b><u>emblem</u></b>	A thing serving as a symbol of a particular quality or concept. <i>Our child would be a dazzling <b>emblem</b> of our love.</i>
<b>enfranchise</b>	Grant voting rights. <i>A proposal that foreigners should be <b>enfranchised</b> for local elections.</i>
<b>exotic</b>	An exotic plant or animal. <i>Protons neutrons electrons and all their <b>exotic</b> variants.</i>
<b><u>federation</u></b>	A group of states with a central government but independence in internal affairs. <i>A first step in the <b>federation</b> of Europe.</i>
<b>inhabitant</b>	A person who fulfils the residential or legal requirements for being a member of a state or parish.
<b>legislature</b>	The legislative body of a country or state. <i>The Nevada state <b>legislature</b> passed a law to prohibit dumping of nuclear waste.</i>
<b>manchester</b>	A city in northwestern England (30 miles to the east of Liverpool); heart of the most densely populated area of England.
<b>nationality</b>	An ethnic group forming a part of one or more political nations. <i>Immigrants of the same <b>nationality</b> often seek each other out.</i>
<b>parliament</b>	(in the UK) the highest legislature, consisting of the Sovereign, the House of Lords, and the House of Commons. <i>The Russian <b>parliament</b>.</i>
<b>patio</b>	Usually paved outdoor area adjoining a residence. <i>The dining room looks out to a small <b>patio</b>.</i>
<b>plebiscite</b>	A vote by the electorate determining public opinion on a question of national importance. <i>The administration will hold a <b>plebiscite</b> for the approval of constitutional reforms.</i>



<b>politics</b>	The profession devoted to governing and to political affairs. <i>The party quickly gained influence in French <b>politics</b>.</i>
<b>referendum</b>	A general vote by the electorate on a single political question which has been referred to them for a direct decision.
<b>reside</b>	Have one's permanent home in a particular place. <i>Legislative powers <b>reside</b> with the Federal Assembly.</i>
<b>resident</b>	An intelligence agent in a foreign country. <i>The film studio needed a <b>resident</b> historian.</i>
<b>sovereignty</b>	The authority of a state to govern another state. <i>The <b>sovereignty</b> of Parliament.</i>
<b>vote</b>	Cause someone to gain or lose a particular post or honour by means of a vote. <i>The nationalist <b>vote</b> in Northern Ireland.</i>
<b>voter</b>	A citizen who has a legal right to vote.
