
Nausea as a Noun

- A feeling of sickness with an inclination to vomit.





Synonyms of "Nausea" as a noun (13 Words)

abhorrence A feeling of revulsion; disgusted loathing.

The thought of marrying him filled her with abhorrence.

aversion The act of turning yourself (or your gaze) away.

My dog s pet aversion is visitors particularly males.

biliousness A disposition to exhibit uncontrolled anger.

detestation A detested person or thing.

Wordsworth s **detestation** of aristocracy.

disgust Strong feelings of dislike.

Some of the audience walked out in **disgust**.

distaste Mild dislike or aversion.

Harry nurtured a **distaste** for all things athletic.



A feeling of intense dislike or disgust; hatred. loathing

The thought filled him with loathing.

State of disgrace resulting from detestable behavior.

He incurred widespread odium for military failures and government odium

corruption.

queasiness A mild state of nausea.

 $\begin{array}{l} \textbf{repugnance} \\ \textbf{Our repugnance} \ at \ the \ bleeding \ carcasses. \end{array}$

The force by which bodies repel one another. repulsion

Bond lengths are increased due to increasing **repulsion** between the atoms.

A sense of disgust and loathing.

revulsion News of the attack will be met with sorrow and **revulsion**.

The state of being ill. sickness

She was absent through sickness.





Usage Examples of "Nausea" as a noun

- A wave of nausea engulfed him.
- The stories will launch a wave of public nausea and outrage.



Associations of "Nausea" (30 Words)

An illness, typically a minor one.

The doctor diagnosed a common stomach ailment.

airsickness Motion sickness experienced while traveling by air (especially during

turbulence.

A chronic or persistent disorder of the mental processes caused by brain

dementia disease or injury and marked by memory disorders, personality changes, and

impaired reasoning.

diarrhea Frequent and watery bowel movements; can be a symptom of infection or food

poisoning or colitis or a gastrointestinal tumor.

Something that makes a person feel physically uncomfortable.

The patient complained of **discomfort** in the left calf.

disgusting Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust.

A **disgusting** smell.

Cause someone to lose their sense of direction disorientate.

disorient The inconsistencies of the narrative do more than merely **disorient** and

challenge the reader.

displeasing Causing annoyance or dissatisfaction; disagreeable.

It was not entirely **displeasing** to be the centre of such a drama.

dizziness A sensation of spinning around and losing one's balance.

The medicine can cause **dizziness** or nausea.

Make dizzy or giddy.

He looked around **dizzy** with happiness.

A neurological disorder marked by sudden recurrent episodes of sensory

epilepsy disturbance, loss of consciousness, or convulsions, associated with abnormal

electrical activity in the brain.

A lessening in one's response to or enthusiasm for something, caused by

fatigue overexposure.

The nails have become rusted through or **fatigue**d.

giddiness An impulsive scatterbrained manner.

Symptoms include nausea vomiting and **giddiness**.

hateful Very unpleasant.

That **hateful** arrogant woman.

headache A continuous pain in the head.

I ve got a splitting **headache**.

Presaging ill fortune.

A look on her face which boded **ill** for anyone who crossed her path.

A recurrent throbbing headache that typically affects one side of the head and

migraine is often accompanied by nausea and disturbed vision.

An attack of **migraine**.

Causing or liable to cause a feeling of nausea or disgust; disgusting.

nauseating The stench was nauseating.

nauseous Disgusting or offensive.

This **nauseous** account of a court case.

numbness The trait of lacking enthusiasm for or interest in things generally.

Tingling and **numbness** in the left arm.



pain Cause mental or physical pain to.

Chest **pain**s.

sickening Causing great annoyance or disappointment.

A **sickening** stench.

sickness Defectiveness or unsoundness.

A **sickness** allowance.

squeamish Easily made to feel sick or disgusted.

I ve always been **squeamish** about bugs.

The stomach viewed as the seat of hunger nausea anxiety or other unsettling

stomach feelings.

He cannot **stomach** raw fish.

A state of near-unconsciousness or insensibility.

Someone stole his wallet while he was in a drunken **stupor**.

syncope The loss of sounds from within a word (as in `fo'c'sle' for `forecastle.

unsightly Unpleasant to look at; ugly.

Unsightly billboards.

vertigo A reeling sensation; a feeling that you are about to fall.

vomiting The reflex act of ejecting the contents of the stomach through the mouth.
