<b>automatically</b>	In a reflex manner. <i>His passport was <b>automatically</b> revoked.</i>
<b>by definition</b>	So as to pass a given point.
<b>by force majeure</b>	In reserve; not for immediate use.
<b>by force of circumstance</b>	In reserve; not for immediate use.
<u><a href="#">certainly</a></u>	Used to emphasize the speaker's belief that what is said is true. <i>She <b>certainly</b> is a hard worker.</i>
<b>definitely</b>	Without question and beyond doubt. <i>I shall <b>definitely</b> be at the airport to meet you.</i>
<b>incontrovertibly</b>	In an obvious and provable manner.
<b>ineluctably</b>	By necessity.
<b>inescapably</b>	In a way that cannot be avoided or ignored; undeniably. <i>An ideological conflict <b>inescapably</b> tied to religion.</i>
<u><a href="#">inevitably</a></u>	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>War <b>inevitably</b> has casualties.</i>
<b>needfully</b>	In an essential manner.
<b>needs</b>	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>We must <b>needs</b> by objective.</i>
<u><a href="#">surely</a></u>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>If there is no will then <b>surely</b> the house goes automatically to you.</i>
<b>unavoidably</b>	In a way that cannot be avoided, prevented, or ignored. <i>The book becomes perhaps <b>unavoidably</b> slightly repetitive.</i>
<u><a href="#">undoubtedly</a></u>	Without doubt; certainly. <i>It s <b>undoubtedly</b> very beautiful.</i>

- *Such expenses are necessarily incurred.*
- *It is necessarily so.*

<b>essential</b>	Absolutely necessary; vitally necessary. <i>The <b>essentials</b> of the good life.</i>
<b>important</b>	Important in effect or meaning. <i><b>Important</b> habitats for wildlife.</i>
<b>incidentally</b>	Of a minor or subordinate nature. <i><b>Incidentally</b> it was many months before the whole truth was discovered.</i>
<b>indispensability</b>	The quality possessed by something that you cannot possibly do without.
<b>indispensable</b>	Absolutely necessary. <i>Foods <b>indispensable</b> to good nutrition.</i>
<b>ineluctable</b>	Impossible to avoid or evade. <i>The <b>ineluctable</b> facts of history.</i>
<b>inevitable</b>	Invariably occurring or appearing. <i>By the morning he had accepted the <b>inevitable</b>.</i>
<b>inevitably</b>	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i><b>Inevitably</b> some details are already out of date.</i>
<b>insurmountable</b>	Not capable of being surmounted or overcome. <i><b>Insurmountable</b> disadvantages.</i>
<b>integral</b>	The result of a mathematical integration $F(x)$ is the integral of $f(x)$ if $dF = f(x) dx$ . <i>The unit comes complete with <b>integral</b> pump and heater.</i>
<b>meaningful</b>	Serious, important, or worthwhile. <i><b>Meaningful</b> glances and repressed passion.</i>

<b><u>must</u></b>	Grape juice before or during fermentation. <i>This video is a <b>must</b> for everyone.</i>
<b>necessary</b>	Absolutely essential. <i>A <b>necessary</b> consequence.</i>
<b>necessity</b>	A situation enforcing a certain course of action. <i>Political <b>necessity</b> induced him to consider it.</i>
<b>need</b>	Have or feel a need for. <i>His day to day <b>needs</b>.</i>
<b>needs</b>	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>We must <b>needs</b> by objective.</i>
<b>perforce</b>	Used to express necessity or inevitability. <i>Amateurs <b>perforce</b> have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
<b><u>prerequisite</u></b>	Something that is required in advance. <i>Latin was a <b>prerequisite</b> for admission.</i>
<b>require</b>	Require as useful just or proper. <i>It would have <b>required</b> much research to produce a comprehensive list.</i>
<b>required</b>	Required by rule. <i><b>Required</b> reading.</i>
<b>requisite</b>	Necessary for relief or supply. <i>She believed privacy to be a <b>requisite</b> for a peaceful life.</i>
<b>simultaneously</b>	At the same instant. <i>The telethon was broadcast <b>simultaneously</b> on 31 US networks.</i>
<b><u>unavoidable</u></b>	Impossible to avoid or evade. <i>The natural and <b>unavoidable</b> consequences of growing old.</i>
<b><u>vital</u></b>	Full of spirit. <i>A <b>vital</b> and charismatic leader.</i>
