by definition

So as to pass a given point.

by force majeure

In reserve; not for immediate use.

by force of circumstance

In reserve; not for immediate use.

certainly

Used to emphasize the speaker's belief that what is said is true.

*She **certainly** is a hard worker.*

definitely

Without question and beyond doubt.

*I shall **definitely** be at the airport to meet you.*

incontrovertibly

In an obvious and provable manner.

ineluctably

By necessity.

inescapably

In a way that cannot be avoided or ignored; undeniably.

*An ideological conflict **inescapably** tied to religion.*

inevitably

In such a manner as could not be otherwise.

*War **inevitably** has casualties.*

needfully

In an essential manner.

needs

In such a manner as could not be otherwise.

*We must **needs** by objective.*

surely

Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely.

*If there is no will then **surely** the house goes automatically to you.*

unavoidably

In a way that cannot be avoided, prevented, or ignored.

*The book becomes perhaps **unavoidably** slightly repetitive.*

undoubtedly

Without doubt; certainly.

*It s **undoubtedly** very beautiful.*

Usage Examples of "Necessarily" as an adverb

- *The prognosis can necessarily be only an educated guess.*
- *Such expenses are necessarily incurred.*
- *It is necessarily so.*

inevitable	Invariably occurring or appearing. <i>By the morning he had accepted the inevitable.</i>
inevitably	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>Inevitably some details are already out of date.</i>
insurmountable	Not capable of being surmounted or overcome. <i>Insurmountable disadvantages.</i>
integral	The result of a mathematical integration $\int f(x) dx$ is the integral of $f(x)$ if $dF = f(x) dx$. <i>The unit comes complete with integral pump and heater.</i>
meaningful	Serious, important, or worthwhile. <i>Meaningful glances and repressed passion.</i>

<u>must</u>	Grape juice before or during fermentation. <i>This video is a must for everyone.</i>
necessary	Absolutely essential. <i>A necessary consequence.</i>
necessity	A situation enforcing a certain course of action. <i>Political necessity induced him to consider it.</i>
need	Have or feel a need for. <i>His day to day needs.</i>
needs	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>We must needs by objective.</i>
perforce	Used to express necessity or inevitability. <i>Amateurs perforce have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
<u>prerequisite</u>	Something that is required in advance. <i>Latin was a prerequisite for admission.</i>
require	Require as useful just or proper. <i>It would have required much research to produce a comprehensive list.</i>
required	Required by rule. <i>Required reading.</i>
requisite	Necessary for relief or supply. <i>She believed privacy to be a requisite for a peaceful life.</i>
simultaneously	At the same instant. <i>The telethon was broadcast simultaneously on 31 US networks.</i>
<u>unavoidable</u>	Impossible to avoid or evade. <i>The natural and unavoidable consequences of growing old.</i>
<u>vital</u>	Full of spirit. <i>A vital and charismatic leader.</i>
