## Necessitate as a Verb

### Definitions of "Necessitate" as a verb

- *Make it necessary for (someone) to do something.*
- *Require as useful, just, or proper.*
- *Make (something) necessary as a result or consequence.*
- *Cause to be a concomitant.*

| <b>demand</b>           | Ask to be informed of.<br><i>The victim s family is <b>demanding</b> compensation.</i>   |
| <a href="#">involve</a> | Cause to participate in an activity or situation.<br><i>His story completely <b>involved</b> me during the entire afternoon.</i> |
| <b>make necessary</b>   | Head into a specified direction.   |

| <b>need</b>      | Have need of.<br><i>I <b>need</b> help now.</i>   |
| <b>postulate</b> | Take as a given assume as a postulate or axiom.<br><i>She <b>postulated</b> that the environmentalists might have a case.</i> |
| <b>require</b>   | Require as useful just or proper.<br><i>It would have <b>required</b> much research to produce a comprehensive list.</i>      |

- *The late arrival had necessitated her getting out of bed.*
- *A cut which necessitated eighteen stitches.*

| <b>necessity</b>    | The state or fact of being required.<br><i>The <b>necessity</b> of growing old.</i>   |
| <b>need</b>         | Have need of.<br><i>Lest you even more than <b>needs</b> embitter our parting.</i>  |
| <b>needs</b>        | In such a manner as could not be otherwise.<br><i>We must <b>needs</b> by objective.</i>  |
| <b>oblige</b>       | Make (someone) legally or morally bound to do something.<br><i><b>Oblige</b> me by not being sorry for yourself.</i>  |

| <b>request</b>      | The verbal act of requesting.<br><i>The computer is busy servicing <b>requests</b> from other processes.</i>  |
| <b>require</b>      | Require as useful just or proper.<br><i>The minimum car insurance <b>required</b> by law.</i>   |
| <b>requisite</b>    | Necessary for relief or supply.<br><i>A place where the <b>requisites</b> of water fuel and fodder can be obtained.</i>                                     |
| <b>shortfall</b>    | A deficit of something required or expected.<br><i>They are facing an expected 10 billion <b>shortfall</b> in revenue.</i>                                  |
| <b>suppliant</b>    | Making or expressing a plea, especially to someone in power or authority.<br><i>A <b>suppliant</b> for her favors.</i>                                      |
| <b>supplicant</b>   | Making or expressing a plea, especially to someone in power or authority.<br><i><b>Supplicants</b> prostrate themselves on the floor.</i>                   |
| <b>supplicate</b>   | Ask or beg for something earnestly or humbly.<br><i>He <b>supplicated</b> the King for clemency.</i>  |
| <b>unquenchable</b> | Impossible to quench.<br><i>His enthusiasm was <b>unquenchable</b>.</i>   |
| <b>want</b>         | Hunt or look for want for a particular reason.<br><i>Freedom from <b>want</b>.</i>  |

A thing that is or has been wished for.  
*She must carry out her late father's **wishes**.*

**wishing**

A specific feeling of desire.  
*He was above all **wishing** and desire.*

**yearning**

Involving or expressing yearning.  
*He felt a **yearning** for the mountains.*
