Necessitate as a Verb

Definitions of "Necessitate" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “necessitate” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Make it necessary for (someone) to do something.*
- *Require as useful, just, or proper.*
- *Make (something) necessary as a result or consequence.*
- *Cause to be a concomitant.*

Synonyms of "Necessitate" as a verb (9 Words)

ask	Require or ask for as a price or condition. <i>She asked him round for a drink.</i>
call for	Get or try to get into communication (with someone) by telephone.
demand	Ask to be informed of. <i>The victim s family is demanding compensation.</i>
involve	Cause to participate in an activity or situation. <i>His story completely involved me during the entire afternoon.</i>
make necessary	Head into a specified direction.

need	Have need of. <i>I need help now.</i>
postulate	Take as a given assume as a postulate or axiom. <i>She postulated that the environmentalists might have a case.</i>
require	Require as useful just or proper. <i>It would have required much research to produce a comprehensive list.</i>
take	Take as an undesirable consequence of some event or state of affairs. <i>She always takes an umbrella.</i>

Usage Examples of "Necessitate" as a verb

- *The late arrival had necessitated her getting out of bed.*
- *A cut which necessitated eighteen stitches.*

Associations of "Necessitate" (30 Words)

adjure	Ask for or request earnestly. <i>I adjure you to tell me the truth.</i>
asking	The verbal act of requesting.
covet	Wish, long, or crave for (something, especially the property of another person). <i>I covet one of their smart bags.</i>
demand	The act of demanding. <i>This position demands a lot of personal sacrifice.</i>
desideratum	Something that is needed or wanted. <i>Integrity was a desideratum.</i>
hankering	A yearning for something or to do something. <i>He had a hankering to return to Scotland.</i>
hopefully	It is to be hoped that. <i>He rode on hopefully.</i>
indigence	A state of extreme poverty or destitution. <i>Their indigence appalled him.</i>
indispensability	The quality possessed by something that you cannot possibly do without.
insufficiency	Lack of an adequate quantity or number. <i>Renal insufficiency.</i>

integral	The result of a mathematical integration $\int f(x) dx$ is the integral of $f(x)$. <i>Games are an integral part of the school's curriculum.</i>
necessary	The action or item needed. <i>The necessary consequences of one's actions.</i>
necessity	The state or fact of being required. <i>The necessity of growing old.</i>
need	Have need of. <i>Lest you even more than needs embitter our parting.</i>
needs	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>We must needs by objective.</i>
oblige	Make (someone) legally or morally bound to do something. <i>Oblige me by not being sorry for yourself.</i>
paging	The system of numbering pages. <i>The public address system in the hospital was used for paging.</i>
perforce	Used to express necessity or inevitability. <i>Amateurs perforce have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
request	The verbal act of requesting. <i>The computer is busy servicing requests from other processes.</i>
require	Require as useful just or proper. <i>The minimum car insurance required by law.</i>
requisite	Necessary for relief or supply. <i>A place where the requisites of water fuel and fodder can be obtained.</i>
shortfall	A deficit of something required or expected. <i>They are facing an expected 10 billion shortfall in revenue.</i>
suppliant	Making or expressing a plea, especially to someone in power or authority. <i>A suppliant for her favors.</i>
supplicant	Making or expressing a plea, especially to someone in power or authority. <i>Supplicants prostrate themselves on the floor.</i>
supplicate	Ask or beg for something earnestly or humbly. <i>He supplicated the King for clemency.</i>
unquenchable	Impossible to quench. <i>His enthusiasm was unquenchable.</i>
want	Hunt or look for want for a particular reason. <i>Freedom from want.</i>

wish

A thing that is or has been wished for.
*She must carry out her late father's **wishes**.*

wishing

A specific feeling of desire.
*He was above all **wishing** and desire.*

yearning

Involving or expressing yearning.
*He felt a **yearning** for the mountains.*
