## Necessitate as a Verb

### Definitions of "Necessitate" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “necessitate” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Make it necessary for (someone) to do something.*
- *Require as useful, just, or proper.*
- *Make (something) necessary as a result or consequence.*
- *Cause to be a concomitant.*

### Synonyms of "Necessitate" as a verb (9 Words)

<b>ask</b>	Require or ask for as a price or condition. <i>She <b>asked</b> him round for a drink.</i>
<b>call for</b>	Get or try to get into communication (with someone) by telephone.
<b>demand</b>	Ask to be informed of. <i>The victim s family is <b>demanding</b> compensation.</i>
<a href="#">involve</a>	Cause to participate in an activity or situation. <i>His story completely <b>involved</b> me during the entire afternoon.</i>
<b>make necessary</b>	Head into a specified direction.

<b>need</b>	Have need of. <i>I <b>need</b> help now.</i>
<b>postulate</b>	Take as a given assume as a postulate or axiom. <i>She <b>postulated</b> that the environmentalists might have a case.</i>
<b>require</b>	Require as useful just or proper. <i>It would have <b>required</b> much research to produce a comprehensive list.</i>
<b>take</b>	Take as an undesirable consequence of some event or state of affairs. <i>She always <b>takes</b> an umbrella.</i>

### Usage Examples of "Necessitate" as a verb

- *The late arrival had necessitated her getting out of bed.*
- *A cut which necessitated eighteen stitches.*

### Associations of "Necessitate" (30 Words)

<b>adjure</b>	Ask for or request earnestly. <i>I <b>adjure</b> you to tell me the truth.</i>
<b>asking</b>	The verbal act of requesting.
<b>covet</b>	Wish, long, or crave for (something, especially the property of another person). <i>I <b>covet</b> one of their smart bags.</i>
<b>demand</b>	The act of demanding. <i>This position <b>demands</b> a lot of personal sacrifice.</i>
<b>desideratum</b>	Something that is needed or wanted. <i>Integrity was a <b>desideratum</b>.</i>
<b>hankering</b>	A yearning for something or to do something. <i>He had a <b>hankering</b> to return to Scotland.</i>
<b>hopefully</b>	It is to be hoped that. <i>He rode on <b>hopefully</b>.</i>
<b>indigence</b>	A state of extreme poverty or destitution. <i>Their <b>indigence</b> appalled him.</i>
<b>indispensability</b>	The quality possessed by something that you cannot possibly do without.
<b>insufficiency</b>	Lack of an adequate quantity or number. <i>Renal <b>insufficiency</b>.</i>

<b>integral</b>	The result of a mathematical integration $\int f(x) dx$ is the integral of $f(x)$ . <i>Games are an <b>integral</b> part of the school's curriculum.</i>
<b>necessary</b>	The action or item needed. <i>The <b>necessary</b> consequences of one's actions.</i>
<b>necessity</b>	The state or fact of being required. <i>The <b>necessity</b> of growing old.</i>
<b>need</b>	Have need of. <i>Lest you even more than <b>needs</b> embitter our parting.</i>
<b>needs</b>	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>We must <b>needs</b> by objective.</i>
<b>oblige</b>	Make (someone) legally or morally bound to do something. <i><b>Oblige</b> me by not being sorry for yourself.</i>
<b>paging</b>	The system of numbering pages. <i>The public address system in the hospital was used for <b>paging</b>.</i>
<b>perforce</b>	Used to express necessity or inevitability. <i>Amateurs <b>perforce</b> have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
<b>request</b>	The verbal act of requesting. <i>The computer is busy servicing <b>requests</b> from other processes.</i>
<b>require</b>	Require as useful just or proper. <i>The minimum car insurance <b>required</b> by law.</i>
<b>requisite</b>	Necessary for relief or supply. <i>A place where the <b>requisites</b> of water fuel and fodder can be obtained.</i>
<b>shortfall</b>	A deficit of something required or expected. <i>They are facing an expected 10 billion <b>shortfall</b> in revenue.</i>
<b>suppliant</b>	Making or expressing a plea, especially to someone in power or authority. <i>A <b>suppliant</b> for her favors.</i>
<b>supplicant</b>	Making or expressing a plea, especially to someone in power or authority. <i><b>Supplicants</b> prostrate themselves on the floor.</i>
<b>supplicate</b>	Ask or beg for something earnestly or humbly. <i>He <b>supplicated</b> the King for clemency.</i>
<b>unquenchable</b>	Impossible to quench. <i>His enthusiasm was <b>unquenchable</b>.</i>
<b>want</b>	Hunt or look for want for a particular reason. <i>Freedom from <b>want</b>.</i>

**wish**

A thing that is or has been wished for.  
*She must carry out her late father's **wishes**.*

**wishing**

A specific feeling of desire.  
*He was above all **wishing** and desire.*

**yearning**

Involving or expressing yearning.  
*He felt a **yearning** for the mountains.*
