- essential** Anything indispensable.  
*We only had the bare **essentials** in the way of equipment.*
- necessary** The money needed.  
*A bag containing my wallet the money the **necessary**.*
- requirement** Anything indispensable.  
*The **requirements** of his work affected his health.*
- requisite** A thing that is necessary for the achievement of a specified end.  
*A place where the **requisites** of water fuel and fodder can be obtained.*



## Associations of "Necessities" (30 Words)

<b>asking</b>	The verbal act of requesting.
<b><u>beseech</u></b>	Ask for or request earnestly. <i>They <b>beseched</b> him to stay.</i>
<b>compel</b>	Force to come or go in a particular direction. <i>His striking appearance <b>compelled</b> attention.</i>
<b>demand</b>	The act of demanding. <i>He s got enough <b>demands</b> on his time already.</i>
<b><u>entreat</u></b>	Treat (someone) in a specified manner. <i>His friends <b>entreated</b> him not to go.</i>
<b>entreaty</b>	Earnest or urgent request. <i>An <b>entreaty</b> to stop the fighting.</i>
<b>essential</b>	Anything indispensable. <i>The <b>essential</b> weakness of the plaintiff's case.</i>

<b>expedience</b>	Taking advantage of opportunities without regard for the consequences for others.
<b>expediency</b>	The quality of being convenient and practical despite possibly being improper or immoral; convenience. <i>An act of political <b>expediency</b>.</i>
<b>indispensability</b>	The quality possessed by something that you cannot possibly do without.
<b><u>indispensable</u></b>	Not to be dispensed with; essential. <i>An <b>indispensable</b> worker.</i>
<b><u>integral</u></b>	The result of a mathematical integration $\int f(x) dx$ is the integral of $f(x)$ if $dF = f(x) dx$ . <i>Games are an <b>integral</b> part of the school's curriculum.</i>
<b>meaningful</b>	Serious, important, or worthwhile. <i>A <b>meaningful</b> discussion.</i>
<b><u>must</u></b>	Expressing insistence. <i>This video is a <b>must</b> for everyone.</i>
<b>necessary</b>	Unavoidably determined by prior circumstances. <i>They granted the <b>necessary</b> planning permission.</i>
<b><u>necessitate</u></b>	Require as useful, just, or proper. <i>A cut which <b>necessitated</b> eighteen stitches.</i>
<b>need</b>	Have or feel a need for. <i>God has no <b>need</b> of men to accomplish His work.</i>
<b>needs</b>	Of necessity. <i>We must <b>needs</b> by objective.</i>
<b>perforce</b>	By necessity; by force of circumstance. <i>Amateurs <b>perforce</b> have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
<b><u>plea</u></b>	A defendant's answer by a factual matter (as distinguished from a demurrer). <i>He made a dramatic <b>plea</b> for disarmament.</i>
<b><u>prerequisite</u></b>	Something that is required in advance. <i>Sponsorship is not a <b>prerequisite</b> for any of our courses.</i>
<b>request</b>	A formal message requesting something that is submitted to an authority. <i>I <b>requested</b> information from the secretary.</i>
<b>require</b>	Require as useful just or proper. <i>The care and diligence <b>required</b> of him as a trustee.</i>
<b>required</b>	Required by rule. <i>Eight editions were published each <b>required</b> reading for trainees.</i>



<b>requisite</b>	Anything indispensable. <i>A place where the <b>requisites</b> of water fuel and fodder can be obtained.</i>
<b><u>staple</u></b>	A piece of thin wire with two short right angled end pieces which are driven by a stapler through sheets of paper to fasten them together. <i><b>Staple</b> the papers together.</i>
<b>supplicate</b>	Ask for humbly or earnestly, as in prayer. <i>The plutocracy <b>supplicated</b> to be made peers.</i>
<b><u>underlying</u></b>	Located beneath or below. <i>The flu can be particularly severe for the elderly and those with <b>underlying</b> conditions.</i>
<b><u>vital</u></b>	Manifesting or characteristic of life. <i>The <b>vital</b> organs.</i>
<b>want</b>	Feel or have a desire for want strongly. <i>This piano <b>wants</b> the attention of a competent tuner.</i>
