#### Definitions of "Neck" as a noun

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "neck" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A cut of meat from the neck of an animal.
- The part of an organism (human or animal) that connects the head to the rest of the body.
- The part of a bottle or other container near the mouth.
- A narrow connecting or end part of something.
- The part of a violin, guitar, or other similar instrument that bears the fingerboard.
- The part of a person's or animal's body connecting the head to the rest of the body.
- A narrow supporting part in a plant, especially the terminal part of the fruiting body in a fern, bryophyte, or fungus.
- A narrow part near one end of an organ, such as the uterus.
- A person's neck regarded as bearing a burden of responsibility or guilt.



- A narrow part of an artifact that resembles a neck in position or form.
- A column of solidified lava or igneous rock formed in a volcanic vent, especially when exposed by erosion.
- A narrow piece of land or sea, such as an isthmus or channel.
- Meat from an animal's neck.
- A narrow elongated projecting strip of land.
- An opening in a garment for the neck of the wearer; a part of the garment near the wearer's neck.
- The part of a garment that is around or close to the neck.
- The length of a horse's head and neck as a measure of its lead in a race.

The part of an armchair or sofa that supports the elbow and forearm of a seated person.

nape The back side of the neck.

Her hair was coiled demurely at the **nape** of her neck.

**narrows** A narrow strait connecting two bodies of water.

**neck opening** A narrow elongated projecting strip of land.

A narrow way allowing access between buildings or to different rooms

**passage** within a building a passageway.

Despite the **passage** of time she still loved him.

scruff The back side of the neck.

He grabbed him by the **scruff** of his neck.

sea passage

A division of an ocean or a large body of salt water partially enclosed by

land.

Sound produced by continuous and regular vibrations as opposed to

**sound** noise.

The main body of the **sound** ran parallel to the coast.

**strait** A narrow channel of the sea joining two larger bodies of water.

Redundancy left him in severe financial **strait**s.

**straits** A difficult juncture.

**stretch of water** An unbroken period of time during which you do something.

A channel at the outer edge of a deck of a boat that allows water to run

waterway off.

The canal was a very successful commercial waterway.

### Definitions of "Neck" as a verb

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "neck" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Swallow (something, especially a drink.
- Kiss, embrace, or fondle with sexual passion.
- (of two people) kiss and caress amorously.
- Form a narrowed part at a particular point when subjected to tension.





### Synonyms of "Neck" as a verb (10 Words)

Touch or stroke lightly in a loving or endearing manner.

A gentle breeze caressed his skin.

gulp down Utter or make a noise, as when swallowing too quickly.

guzzle Drink greedily or as if with great thirst. The boys guzzled the cheap vodka.

**kiss** Touch or caress with the lips as a sign of love, sexual desire, or greeting.

The newly married couple **kiss**ed.

make out Create by artistic means.

**pet** Stroke or pat (an animal) affectionately.

I was cosseted and  ${\it pet}$ ted and never shouted at.

**quaff**To swallow hurriedly or greedily or in one draught.

He **quaff**ed pint after pint of good Berkshire ale.



Take solid or liquid food into the mouth a little at a time either by drinking or

**sup** by eating with a spoon.


*She* **sup**ped up her soup delightedly.

**swallow** Enclose or envelop completely as if by swallowing.

She had **swallow**ed his story hook line and sinker.

swill Accompany (food) with large quantities of drink.


They whiled away their evening **swill**ing pints of bitter.
