- essential** A thing that is absolutely necessary.
*He was quick to grasp the **essentials** of an opponent's argument.*

famine	A shortage. <i>The famine of 1921 2.</i>
indigence	A state of extreme poverty or destitution. <i>Their indigence appalled him.</i>
indispensability	The quality possessed by something that you cannot possibly do without.
indispensable	Unavoidable. <i>An indispensable worker.</i>
insufficiency	The condition of being insufficient. <i>Insufficiency of adequate housing.</i>
integral	The result of a mathematical integration $\int f(x) dx$ is the integral of $f(x)$ if $dF = f(x) dx$. <i>The first integral recording of the ten Mahler symphonies.</i>
lack	Be without or deficient in. <i>Sam did not lack for friends.</i>
must	Something that should not be overlooked or missed. <i>You must be tired.</i>
necessary	The basic requirements of life, such as food and warmth. <i>See when they need a tactful word of advice and do the necessary.</i>
necessitate	Cause to be a concomitant. <i>A cut which necessitated eighteen stitches.</i>
necessity	Anything indispensable. <i>Political necessity induced him to consider it.</i>
needs	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>We must needs by objective.</i>
oblige	Commit in order to fulfill an obligation. <i>The lynx is an oblige carnivore.</i>
oblige	Bind (someone) by an oath, promise, or contract. <i>Oblige me by not being sorry for yourself.</i>
perforce	By necessity; by force of circumstance. <i>Amateurs perforce have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
prerequisite	Something that is required in advance. <i>Sponsorship is not a prerequisite for any of our courses.</i>
request	A tune or song played on a radio programme typically accompanied by a personal message in response to a listener's request. <i>The letter requested him to report to London.</i>
require	Require as useful just or proper. <i>You will be required to attend for cross examination.</i>

required	Required by rule. <i>Required reading.</i>
requisite	A thing that is necessary for the achievement of a specified end. <i>She believed privacy to be a requisite for a peaceful life.</i>
scarcity	A small and inadequate amount. <i>A time of scarcity.</i>
<u>shortage</u>	A state or situation in which something needed cannot be obtained in sufficient amounts. <i>A shortage of hard cash.</i>
shortfall	The property of being an amount by which something is less than expected or required. <i>They are facing an expected 10 billion shortfall in revenue.</i>
<u>vital</u>	The body's important internal organs. <i>The loss of vital heat in shock.</i>
want	Feel or have a desire for want strongly. <i>You don't want to believe everything you hear.</i>
