- *So small or unimportant as to be not worth considering; insignificant.*
- *Not worth considering.*
- *So small as to be meaningless; insignificant.*



## Synonyms of "Negligible" as an adjective (31 Words)

<b>extraneous</b>	Coming from the outside. <i>One is obliged to wade through many pages of <b>extraneous</b> material.</i>
<b>flimsy</b>	Lacking substance or significance. <i>A pretty <b>flimsy</b> excuse.</i>
<b>footling</b>	(informal) small and of little importance. <i>Year after year you come with the same <b>footling</b> complaint.</i>
<b>frivolous</b>	Not having any serious purpose or value. <i>A <b>frivolous</b> remark.</i>
<b><u>immaterial</u></b>	(often followed by `to') lacking importance; not mattering one way or the other. <i>The difference in our ages is <b>immaterial</b>.</i>
<b><u>inconsequential</u></b>	Not following logically as a consequence. <i>They talked about <b>inconsequential</b> things.</i>

<b>inconsiderable</b>	Too small or unimportant to merit attention. <i>A not <b>inconsiderable</b> amount of money.</i>
<b>insubstantial</b>	Lacking solidity or strength. <i>The huts are relatively few and <b>insubstantial</b>.</i>
<b>irrelevant</b>	Having no bearing on or connection with the subject at issue. <i><b>Irrelevant</b> allegations.</i>
<b>meagre</b>	(of something provided or available) lacking in quantity or quality. <i>They were forced to supplement their <b>meagre</b> earnings.</i>
<b>not worth mentioning</b>	Worthy of being treated in a particular way (often used ironically).
<b>not worth speaking of</b>	Having a specified value.
<b>nugatory</b>	Useless or futile. <i>A <b>nugatory</b> law.</i>
<b>of little consequence</b>	Limited or below average in number or quantity or magnitude or extent.
<b>of little import</b>	Small and of little importance.
<b>of little importance</b>	Small and of little importance.
<b>of minor importance</b>	Of a scale or mode.
<b>of no account</b>	Quantifier; used with either mass nouns or plural count nouns for indicating a complete or almost complete lack or zero quantity of.
<b>of no consequence</b>	Quantifier; used with either mass nouns or plural count nouns for indicating a complete or almost complete lack or zero quantity of.
<b>of no importance</b>	Quantifier; used with either mass nouns or plural count nouns for indicating a complete or almost complete lack or zero quantity of.
<b>of no moment</b>	Quantifier; used with either mass nouns or plural count nouns for indicating a complete or almost complete lack or zero quantity of.
<b>paltry</b>	(of an amount) very small or meagre. <i>He considered the prize too <b>paltry</b> for the lives it must cost.</i>
<b>peripheral</b>	Of secondary or minor importance; marginal. <i><b>Peripheral</b> suburbs.</i>
<b>petty</b>	Inferior in rank or status. <i><b>Petty</b> little comments.</i>
<b>pointless</b>	Having no points scores. <i>It s <b>pointless</b> to plan too far ahead.</i>
<b>scanty</b>	Lacking in amplitude or quantity. <i>Her dress was <b>scanty</b> and revealing.</i>

<b>trifling</b>	Unimportant or trivial. <i>A <b>trifling</b> matter.</i>
<b>trivial</b>	Concerned with trivialities. <i>A <b>trivial</b> young woman.</i>
<b>unimportant</b>	Devoid of importance, meaning, or force. <i>The question seems <b>unimportant</b>.</i>
<b>unsubstantial</b>	Having little or no solidity, reality, or factual basis. <i>A pretty if <b>unsubstantial</b> cubist composition.</i>
<b>worthless</b>	Having no real value or use. <i>That promise is <b>worthless</b>.</i>

<b>few</b>	The minority of people; the elect. <i><b>Few</b> women have led troops in battle.</i>
<b>inconsequential</b>	Not following logically as a consequence. <i>His work seems trivial and <b>inconsequential</b>.</i>
<b>inconsiderable</b>	Of small size, amount, or extent. <i>A not <b>inconsiderable</b> artist.</i>
<b>insignificant</b>	(of a person) without power or influence. <i>She was so small and <b>insignificant</b>.</i>
<b>insubstantial</b>	Lacking material form or substance; unreal. <i>The flickering light made her face seem <b>insubstantial</b>.</i>
<b>least</b>	Used in names of very small animals and plants e.g least shrew. <i>I never hid the truth <b>least</b> of all from you.</i>
<b>less</b>	Of lower rank or importance. <i>A shower uses <b>less</b> water.</i>
<b>little</b>	Informal small and of little importance. <i>The plants will grow into <b>little</b> bushes.</i>
<b>marginal</b>	Relating to or at the edge or margin. <i><b>Marginal</b> notes.</i>

<b>meanness</b>	Lack of quality or attractiveness; shabbiness. <i>He is also callous with a streak of <b>meanness</b>.</i>
<b>mini</b>	Denoting a miniature version of something. <i><b>Miniskirts</b>.</i>
<b>miniature</b>	Painting or drawing included in a book (especially in illuminated medieval manuscripts). <i>Children dressed as <b>miniature</b> adults.</i>
<b>minimal</b>	The least possible. <i>A <b>minimal</b> charge for the service.</i>
<b>minimum</b>	The least possible. <i>This can be done with the <b>minimum</b> amount of effort.</i>
<b>minor</b>	A minor key interval or scale. <i>Jones <b>minor</b>.</i>
<b>paltry</b>	(of an amount) very small or meagre. <i>She would earn a <b>paltry</b> 33 more a month.</i>
<b>peccadillo</b>	A petty misdeed. <i>The sexual <b>peccadilloes</b> of celebrities aren't necessarily news.</i>
<b>pettiness</b>	Lack of generosity in trifling matters. <i>The sheer <b>pettiness</b> of the officials was quite startling.</i>
<b>picayune</b>	Of little value or significance; petty. <i>The <b>picayune</b> squabbling of party politicians.</i>
<b>piddling</b>	Small and of little importance. <i><b>Piddling</b> little questions.</i>
<b>slight</b>	Being of delicate or slender build. <i>An unintended <b>slight</b> can create grudges.</i>
<b>slightly</b>	In a slim or slender manner. <i>A <b>slightly</b> built girl.</i>
<b>tapered</b>	Becoming gradually narrower. <i>Trousers with <b>tapered</b> legs.</i>
<b>tenuous</b>	Having thin consistency. <i>A <b>tenuous</b> argument.</i>
<b>tiny</b>	Very small. <i><b>Tiny</b> feet.</i>
<b>trifling</b>	Not worth considering. <i>A <b>trifling</b> matter.</i>
<b>trivial</b>	Concerned with trivialities. <i>Huge fines were imposed for <b>trivial</b> offences.</i>

<b>undersized</b>	Smaller than normal for its kind. <i>The <b>undersized</b> cubs may not survive the winter.</i>
<b><u>unimportant</u></b>	Not important. <i>Trivial and <b>unimportant</b> details.</i>
<b>unreported</b>	Not reported. <i>Many human rights abuses went <b>unreported</b>.</i>
