Definitions of "Neighborhood" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “neighborhood” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An area within a city or town that has some distinctive features (especially one forming a community).*
- *People living near one another.*
- *A surrounding or nearby region.*
- *The approximate amount of something (usually used prepositionally as in `in the region of).*



Synonyms of "Neighborhood" as a noun (5 Words)

locality	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>The rock s size and locality.</i>
neck of the woods	The part of an organism (human or animal) that connects the head to the rest of the body.
neighbourhood	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>She lived in a wealthy neighbourhood of Boston.</i>
<u>region</u>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>The lumbar region.</i>
vicinity	The area near or surrounding a particular place. <i>The abundance and vicinity of country seats.</i>



Usage Examples of "Neighborhood" as a noun

- *He always blames someone else in the immediate neighborhood.*
- *An ethnic neighborhood.*
- *It is a friendly neighborhood.*

- *My neighborhood voted for Bush.*
- *The price is in the neighborhood of \$100.*



Associations of "Neighborhood" (30 Words)

borough	A town sending representatives to Parliament.
burgher	A descendant of a Dutch or Portuguese colonist in Sri Lanka. <i>The poem is not the sort of thing the sturdy burghers of Manchester would wish to read.</i>
city	A town created a city by charter and usually containing a cathedral. <i>The city voted for Republicans in 1994.</i>
constituency	An area whose voters elect a representative to a legislative body. <i>Most politicians are more interested in the voice of their constituency.</i>
county	Relating to or characteristic of aristocratic people with an ancestral home in a particular county. <i>It is the county's third final in four years.</i>
denizen	A person who inhabits a particular place. <i>Denizens of field and forest.</i>
district	A division of a county or region that elects its own councillors. <i>An elegant shopping district.</i>
domain	The content of a particular field of knowledge. <i>The country's isolation in the domain of sport.</i>

<u>domestic</u>	Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i>Domesticated plants like maize.</i>
downtown	In or into a downtown area. <i>The heart of Pittsburgh s downtown.</i>
dweller	A person who inhabits a particular place. <i>The majority of urban dwellers live in small apartments.</i>
home	Provide with or send to a home. <i>Each year thousands of cats which could have been homed are being needlessly put down.</i>
inhabitant	A person who inhabits a particular place.
<u>local</u>	A local branch of an organization especially a trade union. <i>The local post office.</i>
locality	The position or site of something. <i>The rock s size and locality.</i>
manor	The landed estate of a lord (including the house on it). <i>They were the undisputed rulers of their manor.</i>
metropolitan	Relating to or denoting a metropolitan or his see. <i>A sophisticated metropolitan.</i>
municipal	Relating or belonging to or characteristic of a municipality. <i>National and municipal elections.</i>
<u>national</u>	Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i>A national newspaper.</i>
<u>population</u>	The act of populating (causing to live in a place). <i>Areas of sparse population.</i>
populous	Having a large population; densely populated. <i>The populous city of Shanghai.</i>
<u>province</u>	A district under an archbishop or a metropolitan. <i>She knew little about wine that had been her father s province.</i>
quarter	Divide by four divide into quarters. <i>They have strong muscular quarters.</i>
<u>region</u>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>Penguins inhabit the polar regions.</i>
resident	(of a bird, butterfly or other animal) remaining in an area throughout the year; non-migratory. <i>The hotel restaurant is open to residents and guests of residents.</i>

- residential** Designed for people to live in.
*A **residential** sixth form college.*
- subdivide** Divide into smaller and smaller pieces.
*This apartment cannot be **subdivided** any further.*
- town** The permanent residents of a university town.
*He has moved to **town**.*
- underpopulated** Having an insufficient or very small population.
*The rocky and **underpopulated** west coast.*
- vicinity** Proximity in space or relationship.
*The plane crashed in the **vicinity** of Asheville.*
