inhabitant	A person who inhabits a particular place.
<u>local</u>	A local branch of an organization especially a trade union. The local post office.
locality	The position or site of something. <i>The rock s size and locality.</i>
manor	The landed estate of a lord (including the house on it. They were the undisputed rulers of their manor .
metropolitan	Relating to or denoting a metropolitan or his see. A sophisticated metropolitan .
municipal	Relating or belonging to or characteristic of a municipality. National and municipal elections.
