### Definitions of "Neighborhood" as a noun

- *People living near one another.*
- *A surrounding or nearby region.*
- *The approximate amount of something (usually used prepositionally as in `in the region of.*



## Synonyms of "Neighborhood" as a noun (5 Words)

<b>locality</b>	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>The rock s size and <b>locality</b>.</i>
<b>neck of the woods</b>	The part of an organism (human or animal) that connects the head to the rest of the body.
<b>neighbourhood</b>	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>She lived in a wealthy <b>neighbourhood</b> of Boston.</i>
<a href="#"><u>region</u></a>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>The lumbar <b>region</b>.</i>
<b>vicinity</b>	The area near or surrounding a particular place. <i>The abundance and <b>vicinity</b> of country seats.</i>

<b>borough</b>	A town sending representatives to Parliament.
<b>burgher</b>	A descendant of a Dutch or Portuguese colonist in Sri Lanka. <i>The poem is not the sort of thing the sturdy <b>burghers</b> of Manchester would wish to read.</i>
<u><a href="#">city</a></u>	A town created a city by charter and usually containing a cathedral. <i>The <b>city</b> voted for Republicans in 1994.</i>
<u><a href="#">constituency</a></u>	An area whose voters elect a representative to a legislative body. <i>Most politicians are more interested in the voice of their <b>constituency</b>.</i>
<b>county</b>	Relating to or characteristic of aristocratic people with an ancestral home in a particular county. <i>It is the <b>county</b> s third final in four years.</i>
<b>denizen</b>	A person who inhabits a particular place. <i><b>Denizens</b> of field and forest.</i>
<u><a href="#">district</a></u>	A division of a county or region that elects its own councillors. <i>An elegant shopping <b>district</b>.</i>
<b>domain</b>	The content of a particular field of knowledge. <i>The country s isolation in the <b>domain</b> of sport.</i>

<u>domestic</u>	<p>Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i><b>Domesticated</b> plants like maize.</i></p>
downtown	<p>In or into a downtown area. <i>The heart of Pittsburgh s <b>downtown</b>.</i></p>
dweller	<p>A person who inhabits a particular place. <i>The majority of urban <b>dwellers</b> live in small apartments.</i></p>
home	<p>Provide with or send to a home. <i>Each year thousands of cats which could have been <b>homed</b> are being needlessly put down.</i></p>
inhabitant	<p>A person who inhabits a particular place.</p>
<u>local</u>	<p>A local branch of an organization especially a trade union. <i>The <b>local</b> post office.</i></p>
locality	<p>The position or site of something. <i>The rock s size and <b>locality</b>.</i></p>
manor	<p>The landed estate of a lord (including the house on it). <i>They were the undisputed rulers of their <b>manor</b>.</i></p>
metropolitan	<p>Relating to or denoting a metropolitan or his see. <i>A sophisticated <b>metropolitan</b>.</i></p>
municipal	<p>Relating or belonging to or characteristic of a municipality. <i>National and <b>municipal</b> elections.</i></p>
<u>national</u>	<p>Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i>A <b>national</b> newspaper.</i></p>
<u>population</u>	<p>The act of populating (causing to live in a place). <i>Areas of sparse <b>population</b>.</i></p>
populous	<p>Having a large population; densely populated. <i>The <b>populous</b> city of Shanghai.</i></p>
<u>province</u>	<p>A district under an archbishop or a metropolitan. <i>She knew little about wine that had been her father s <b>province</b>.</i></p>
quarter	<p>Divide by four divide into quarters. <i>They have strong muscular <b>quarters</b>.</i></p>
<u>region</u>	<p>The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>Penguins inhabit the polar <b>regions</b>.</i></p>
resident	<p>(of a bird, butterfly or other animal) remaining in an area throughout the year; non-migratory. <i>The hotel restaurant is open to <b>residents</b> and guests of <b>residents</b>.</i></p>



- residential** Designed for people to live in.  
*A **residential** sixth form college.*
- subdivide** Divide into smaller and smaller pieces.  
*This apartment cannot be **subdivided** any further.*
- town** The permanent residents of a university town.  
*He has moved to **town**.*
- underpopulated** Having an insufficient or very small population.  
*The rocky and **underpopulated** west coast.*
- vicinity** Proximity in space or relationship.  
*The plane crashed in the **vicinity** of Asheville.*
