## Associations of "Neither here nor there" (30 Words)

<a href="#">anywhere</a>	At or in or to any place anyplace is used informally for anywhere. <i>He could get <b>anywhere</b> from three to seven years.</i>
<b>be</b>	Be present. <i>That was <b>before</b> the war.</i>
<a href="#">being</a>	Being alive living. <i>A rational <b>being</b>.</i>
<b>concurrent</b>	Agreeing or consistent. <i>He received <b>concurrent</b> sentences of two years imprisonment for each of his two convictions.</i>
<a href="#">empirical</a>	Based on, concerned with, or verifiable by observation or experience rather than theory or pure logic. <i>They provided considerable <b>empirical</b> evidence to support their argument.</i>
<b>everywhere</b>	To or in any or all places; (‘everyplace’ is used informally fo. <i>He carried a gun <b>everywhere</b> he went.</i>
<b>exist</b>	Have an existence be extant. <i>He could barely <b>exist</b> on such a low wage.</i>
<b>existence</b>	A way of living. <i>The biggest tree in <b>existence</b>.</i>
<b>existing</b>	Presently existing. <i>The <b>existing</b> system.</i>
<a href="#">extant</a>	Still in existence; not extinct or destroyed or lost. <i>An <b>extant</b> letter.</i>
<b>habitable</b>	Fit for habitation. <i>The house should be <b>habitable</b> by Christmas.</i>
<b>heretofore</b>	Before now. <i>Diseases that <b>heretofore</b> were usually confined to rural areas.</i>

<b>hitherto</b>	Used in negative statement to describe a situation that has existed up to this point or up to the present time. <i><b>Hitherto</b> part of French West Africa Benin achieved independence in 1960.</i>
<b>hypostasis</b>	The accumulation of fluid or blood in the lower parts of the body or organs under the influence of gravity, as occurs in cases of poor circulation or after death.
<b>live</b>	Be alive at a specified time. <i>I told her where the coffee <b>lived</b> and went back to sleep.</i>
<b>location</b>	A particular place or position. <i>The movie was filmed entirely on <b>location</b>.</i>
<b>now</b>	In these times- Nancy Mitford. <i><b>Now</b> my first impulse was to run away.</i>
<b>outlast</b>	Live longer than. <i>The kind of beauty that will <b>outlast</b> youth.</i>
<b>outlive</b>	Live through (an experience). <i>She <b>outlived</b> her husband by many years.</i>
<b><u>pertain</u></b>	Be in effect or existence in a specified place or at a specified time. <i>Matters <b>pertaining</b> to the organization of government.</i>
<b>place</b>	Take a place in a competition often followed by an ordinal. <i>I can't be in two <b>places</b> at once.</i>
<b><u>presence</u></b>	The impression that something is present. <i>He tested for the <b>presence</b> of radon.</i>
<b>present</b>	Bring forward and present to the mind. <i>She did not expect to find herself in her <b>present</b> situation.</i>
<b><u>reproduction</u></b>	Recall that is hypothesized to work by storing the original stimulus input and reproducing it during recall. <i>Gutenberg's <b>reproduction</b> of holy texts was far more efficient.</i>
<b>somewhere</b>	In or at or to some place someplace is used informally for somewhere. <i>She must be <b>somewhere</b>.</i>
<b><u>survival</u></b>	Something that survives. <i>His shorts were a <b>survival</b> from his army days.</i>
<b><u>survive</u></b>	Support oneself. <i>Against all odds the child <b>survived</b>.</i>
<b><u>sustain</u></b>	An effect or facility on a keyboard or electronic instrument whereby a note can be sustained after the key is released. <i>This thought had <b>sustained</b> him throughout the years.</i>
