<b>learner</b>	A person who is learning a subject or skill. <i>A fast <b>learner</b>.</i>
<b>newbie</b>	Any new participant in some activity.
<b>newcomer</b>	A recent arrival. <i>She s a <b>newcomer</b> to the area.</i>
<b>novice</b>	An animal, especially a racehorse, that has not yet won a major prize or reached a sufficient level of performance to qualify for important events. <i>He was a complete <b>novice</b> in foreign affairs.</i>
<b>novitiate</b>	The period or state of being a novice, especially in a religious order.
<b>proselyte</b>	A new convert; especially a gentile converted to Judaism.
<b>raw recruit</b>	Informal terms for nakedness.
<b>starter</b>	A person or thing that starts in a specified way. <i>Consumers upgrading from a regular mobile phone to a <b>starter</b> smartphone.</i>
<b>tyro</b>	A beginner or novice.

- *A cast of neophyte actors.*



## Associations of "Neophyte" (30 Words)

<b>amateur</b>	Someone who pursues a study or sport as a pastime. <i>It takes five years for a top <b>amateur</b> to become a real Tour de France rider.</i>
<b>appetizer</b>	Something that arouses or increases anticipation for what is to follow. <i>The meal started off with an assortment of <b>appetizers</b> including mini egg rolls and fried mozzarella.</i>
<u>apprentice</u>	Be or work as an apprentice. <i>She <b>apprenticed</b> with midwives in San Francisco.</i>
<u>beginner</u>	A person who founds or establishes some institution. <i>An absolute <b>beginner</b>.</i>
<b>entrant</b>	A commodity that enters competition with established merchandise. <i>The prize will be awarded to the <b>entrant</b> who wins the tiebreak.</i>
<u>fledgling</u>	Any new participant in some activity. <i>A <b>fledgling</b> enterprise.</i>
<u>founder</u>	Inflammation of the laminated tissue that attaches the hoof to the foot of a horse. <i>The project <b>foundered</b>.</i>
<b>freshen</b>	Make (something) newer, cleaner, or more attractive. <i>The yachts picked up a <b>freshening</b> breeze.</i>
<b>freshman</b>	A first-year student at university. <i><b>Freshman</b> year in high school or college.</i>
<b>grader</b>	A wheeled machine for levelling the ground, especially in making roads. <i>A first <b>grader</b>.</i>
<b>illiterate</b>	(of a piece of writing) showing a lack of education; badly written. <i>The ignorant <b>illiterate</b> Town Council.</i>
<b>inexperienced</b>	Lacking practical experience or training. <i>An <b>inexperienced</b> driver.</i>
<b>laity</b>	Ordinary people, as distinct from professionals or experts.
<b>layman</b>	A non-ordained male member of a Church. <i>The book seems well suited to the interested <b>layman</b>.</i>
<b>layperson</b>	A non-ordained member of a Church. <i>His highly successful lectures were meant for an audience of <b>laypersons</b> interested in the natural sciences.</i>
<u>learner</u>	A person who is learning a subject or skill. <i>A fast <b>learner</b>.</i>

<b>modestly</b>	In a manner that is not elaborate or luxurious. <i>A <b>modestly</b> furnished flat.</i>
<b>newbie</b>	Any new participant in some activity.
<b><u>newcomer</u></b>	A recent arrival. <i>She s a <b>newcomer</b> to the area.</i>
<b>novice</b>	Someone who has entered a religious order but has not taken final vows. <i>He was a complete <b>novice</b> in foreign affairs.</i>
<b>prentice</b>	Works for an expert to learn a trade. <i>My brother was <b>prenticed</b> to a wheelwright.</i>
<b><u>rookie</u></b>	A new recruit, especially in the army or police. <i>A <b>rookie</b> cop.</i>
<b>salad</b>	A mixture containing a specified ingredient served with a dressing. <i>A red pepper filled with tuna <b>salad</b>.</i>
<b>sophomore</b>	Used of the second year in United States high school or college. <i>Their <b>sophomore</b> year in college.</i>
<b><u>starter</u></b>	Food or drink to stimulate the appetite (usually served before a meal or as the first course). <i>To make sourdough you need a <b>starter</b>.</i>
<b>tutorial</b>	A session of intensive tuition given by a tutor to an individual or to a small number of students. <i><b>Tutorial</b> sessions.</i>
<b>tyro</b>	Someone new to a field or activity.
<b>unpracticed</b>	Not having had extensive practice.
<b><u>unprofessional</u></b>	Below or contrary to the standards expected in a particular profession. <i>Described in <b>unprofessional</b> language so that high school students could understand it.</i>
<b><u>unskilled</u></b>	Lacking professional skill or expertise. <i><b>Unskilled</b> manual workers.</i>
