<b>courage</b>	A quality of spirit that enables you to face danger or pain without showing fear. <i>He fought his illness with great <b>courage</b>.</i>
<b>cranial</b>	Of or relating to the cranium which encloses the brain.
<b>daring</b>	Disposed to venture or take risks. <i>The <b>daring</b> of the players brings fortune or ruin.</i>
<b>deafness</b>	The condition of lacking the power of hearing or having impaired hearing. <i>The baby is at risk of being born with profound <b>deafness</b>.</i>
<b>fortitude</b>	Strength of mind that enables one to endure adversity with courage. <i>She endured her illness with great <b>fortitude</b>.</i>
<b>insensitivity</b>	The inability to respond to affective changes in your interpersonal environment. <i>Signs of malnutrition include <b>insensitivity</b> to pain.</i>

<b>manliness</b>	The fact of being typically male; masculinity. <i>The author s alleged lack of <b>manliness</b>.</i>
<b>mettle</b>	A person’s ability to cope well with difficulties; spirit and resilience. <i>The team showed their true <b>mettle</b> in the second half.</i>
<b>neural</b>	Of or relating to the nervous system. <i><b>Neural</b> disorder.</i>
<b>neuron</b>	A cell that is specialized to conduct nerve impulses. An expert in neuroscience.
<b>neuroscientist</b>	<i>There is a significant and growing need among <b>neuroscientists</b> to exchange experimental data.</i>
<b>neurotically</b>	In a neurotic manner.
<b>olfactory</b>	Relating to the sense of smell. <i>The <b>olfactory</b> organs.</i>
<b>palsy</b>	Affect with palsy. <i>Is the calmness of philosophy or the <b>palsy</b> of insensibility to be looked for.</i>
<b>paralysis</b>	Loss of the ability to move a body part. <i>The <b>paralysis</b> gripping the country.</i>
<b>pathway</b>	A sequence of chemical reactions undergone by a compound or class of compounds in a living organism. <i>These neural <b>pathways</b> control vocalization.</i>
<b>prowess</b>	A superior skill that you can learn by study and practice and observation. <i>His <b>prowess</b> as a fisherman.</i>
<b>resourcefulness</b>	The ability to find quick and clever ways to overcome difficulties. <i>A man of great <b>resourcefulness</b>.</i>
<b>sensory</b>	Of a nerve fiber or impulse originating outside and passing toward the central nervous system. <i><b>Sensory</b> experience.</i>
<b>synapse</b>	A junction between two nerve cells, consisting of a minute gap across which impulses pass by diffusion of a neurotransmitter. <i>Nerve impulses cross a <b>synapse</b> through the action of neurotransmitters.</i>
<b>unflinching</b>	Not showing fear or hesitation in the face of danger or difficulty. <i>He has shown <b>unflinching</b> determination throughout the campaign.</i>
<b>valor</b>	The qualities of a hero or heroine; exceptional or heroic courage when facing danger (especially in battle). <i>He received a medal for <b>valor</b>.</i>
