cranial	Of or relating to the cranium which encloses the brain.
daring	Disposed to venture or take risks. The <b>daring</b> of the players brings fortune or ruin.
deafness	The condition of lacking the power of hearing or having impaired hearing. The baby is at risk of being born with profound <b>deafness</b> .
fortitude	Strength of mind that enables one to endure adversity with courage. <i>She endured her illness with great fortitude</i> .
insensitivity	The inability to respond to affective changes in your interpersonal environment. Signs of malnutrition include <b>insensitivity</b> to pain.



manliness	The fact of being typically male; masculinity. The author s alleged lack of <b>manliness</b> .
mettle	A person's ability to cope well with difficulties; spirit and resilience. The team showed their true <b>mettle</b> in the second half.
neural	Of or relating to the nervous system. <i>Neural disorder.</i>
neuron	A cell that is specialized to conduct nerve impulses.
neuroscientist	An expert in neuroscience. There is a significant and growing need among <b>neuroscientist</b> s to exchange experimental data.
neurotically	In a neurotic manner.
olfactory	Relating to the sense of smell. The <b>olfactory</b> organs.
palsy	Affect with palsy. <i>Is the calmness of philosophy or the <b>palsy</b> of insensibility to be looked for.</i>
paralysis	Loss of the ability to move a body part. The <b>paralysis</b> gripping the country.
<u>pathway</u>	A sequence of chemical reactions undergone by a compound or class of compounds in a living organism. These neural <b>pathway</b> s control vocalization.
<u>prowess</u>	A superior skill that you can learn by study and practice and observation. <i>His <b>prowess</b> as a fisherman.</i>
resourcefulness	The ability to find quick and clever ways to overcome difficulties. A man of great <b>resourcefulness</b> .
<u>sensory</u>	Of a nerve fiber or impulse originating outside and passing toward the central nervous system. <i>Sensory experience</i> .
synapse	A junction between two nerve cells, consisting of a minute gap across which impulses pass by diffusion of a neurotransmitter. <i>Nerve impulses cross a synapse</i> through the action of neurotransmitters.
unflinching	Not showing fear or hesitation in the face of danger or difficulty. <i>He has shown <b>unflinching</b> determination throughout the campaign.</i>
<u>valor</u>	The qualities of a hero or heroine; exceptional or heroic courage when facing danger (especially in battle. <i>He received a medal for valor</i> .
