| cerebral | Involving intelligence rather than emotions or instinct. <i>A cerebral haemorrhage.</i> |
| courage | A quality of spirit that enables you to face danger or pain without showing fear. <i>He fought his illness with great courage.</i> |
| cranial | Of or relating to the cranium which encloses the brain. |
| daring | Disposed to venture or take risks. <i>The daring of the players brings fortune or ruin.</i> |
| deafness | The condition of lacking the power of hearing or having impaired hearing. <i>The baby is at risk of being born with profound deafness.</i> |
| fortitude | Strength of mind that enables one to endure adversity with courage. <i>She endured her illness with great fortitude.</i> |
| insensitivity | The inability to respond to affective changes in your interpersonal environment. <i>Signs of malnutrition include insensitivity to pain.</i> |

| manliness | The fact of being typically male; masculinity. <i>The author s alleged lack of manliness.</i> |
| mettle | A person’s ability to cope well with difficulties; spirit and resilience. <i>The team showed their true mettle in the second half.</i> |
| neural | Of or relating to the nervous system. <i>Neural disorder.</i> |
| neuron | A cell that is specialized to conduct nerve impulses. An expert in neuroscience. |
| neuroscientist | <i>There is a significant and growing need among neuroscientists to exchange experimental data.</i> |
| neurotically | In a neurotic manner. |
| olfactory | Relating to the sense of smell. <i>The olfactory organs.</i> |
| palsy | Affect with palsy. <i>Is the calmness of philosophy or the palsy of insensibility to be looked for.</i> |
| paralysis | Loss of the ability to move a body part. <i>The paralysis gripping the country.</i> |
| pathway | A sequence of chemical reactions undergone by a compound or class of compounds in a living organism. <i>These neural pathways control vocalization.</i> |
| prowess | A superior skill that you can learn by study and practice and observation. <i>His prowess as a fisherman.</i> |
| resourcefulness | The ability to find quick and clever ways to overcome difficulties. <i>A man of great resourcefulness.</i> |
| sensory | Of a nerve fiber or impulse originating outside and passing toward the central nervous system. <i>Sensory experience.</i> |
| synapse | A junction between two nerve cells, consisting of a minute gap across which impulses pass by diffusion of a neurotransmitter. <i>Nerve impulses cross a synapse through the action of neurotransmitters.</i> |
| unflinching | Not showing fear or hesitation in the face of danger or difficulty. <i>He has shown unflinching determination throughout the campaign.</i> |
| valor | The qualities of a hero or heroine; exceptional or heroic courage when facing danger (especially in battle). <i>He received a medal for valor.</i> |

The masculine property of being capable of copulation and procreation.
