## Associations of "Never ending" (30 Words)

<b>coda</b>	The concluding passage of a piece or movement, typically forming an addition to the basic structure. <i>The first movement ends with a fortissimo <b>coda</b>.</i>
<b>completion</b>	The action or process of completing or finishing something. <i>The <b>completion</b> date is early next year.</i>
<a href="#">conclude</a>	Bring to a close. <i>They <b>concluded</b> an economic agreement.</i>
<b>conclusion</b>	A final settlement. <i>Jump to a <b>conclusion</b>.</i>
<b>conclusive</b>	Forming an end or termination; especially putting an end to doubt or question. <i>A <b>conclusive</b> 5 0 win.</i>
<b>consequence</b>	The outcome of an event especially as relative to an individual. <i>His decision had depressing <b>consequences</b> for business.</i>
<b>consequent</b>	Following as a result or effect. <i>The social problems of pupils and their <b>consequent</b> educational difficulties.</i>
<a href="#">culminate</a>	Reach the highest or most decisive point. <i>Seurat <b>culminated</b> pointillism.</i>
<b>deciding</b>	Having the power or quality of deciding. <i>Taxes could be the <b>deciding</b> factor for millions of floating voters.</i>
<a href="#">decisive</a>	Determining or having the power to determine an outcome. <i>The archers played a <b>decisive</b> part in the victory.</i>
<b>definitive</b>	A definitive postage stamp. <i>The <b>definitive</b> biography of Prince Charles.</i>
<a href="#">destination</a>	The place designated as the end (as of a race or journey). <i>He was nearly exhausted as their <b>destination</b> came into view.</i>

<b>determination</b>	A tendency to move in a fixed direction. <i><b>Determination</b> of molecular structures.</i>
<b>determinative</b>	A determining or causal element or factor. <i>The <b>determinative</b> or determinant battle.</i>
<b>end</b>	Either of the halves of a sports field or court defended by one team or player. <i>The <b>end</b> managed to hold onto the pass.</i>
<b>epilogue</b>	A short passage added at the end of a literary work. <i>The <b>epilogue</b> told what eventually happened to the main characters.</i>
<b>expiry</b>	The end of a fixed period of time. <i>An <b>expiry</b> date.</i>
<b>final</b>	The final approach of an aircraft to the runway it will be landing on. <i>The <b>final</b> answer.</i>
<b>finale</b>	The closing section of a musical composition. <i>The <b>finale</b> of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony.</i>
<b>finalize</b>	Complete or agree on a finished and definitive version of. <i>Let's <b>finalize</b> the proposal.</i>
<b>finis</b>	The temporal end; the concluding time. <i>The market was up at the <b>finis</b>.</i>
<b>finish</b>	The act of finishing. <i>His best <b>finish</b> in a major tournament was third.</i>
<b>finishing</b>	The act of finishing. <i>The speaker's <b>finishing</b> was greeted with applause.</i>
<b>ineluctable</b>	Unable to be resisted or avoided; inescapable. <i>An <b>ineluctable</b> destiny.</i>
<b>last</b>	On the last occasion before the present previously. <i>I had to miss the <b>last</b> of the movie.</i>
<b>outcome</b>	A phenomenon that follows and is caused by some previous phenomenon. <i>It is the <b>outcome</b> of the vote that counts.</i>
<b>peroration</b>	The concluding section of an oration. <i>He again invoked the theme in an emotional <b>peroration</b>.</i>
<b>result</b>	Produce as a result or residue. <i>Anger may <b>result</b> from an argument.</i>
<b>termination</b>	A word's final syllable or letters or letter, especially when constituting an element in inflection or derivation. <i>The <b>termination</b> of a contract.</i>
