coda	The concluding passage of a piece or movement, typically forming an addition to the basic structure. <i>The first movement ends with a fortissimo coda.</i>
completion	The action or process of completing or finishing something. <i>The completion date is early next year.</i>
conclude	Bring to a close. <i>They concluded an economic agreement.</i>
conclusion	A final settlement. <i>Jump to a conclusion.</i>
conclusive	Forming an end or termination; especially putting an end to doubt or question. <i>A conclusive 5 0 win.</i>
consequence	The outcome of an event especially as relative to an individual. <i>His decision had depressing consequences for business.</i>
consequent	Following as a result or effect. <i>The social problems of pupils and their consequent educational difficulties.</i>
culminate	Reach the highest or most decisive point. <i>Seurat culminated pointillism.</i>
deciding	Having the power or quality of deciding. <i>Taxes could be the deciding factor for millions of floating voters.</i>
decisive	Determining or having the power to determine an outcome. <i>The archers played a decisive part in the victory.</i>
definitive	A definitive postage stamp. <i>The definitive biography of Prince Charles.</i>
destination	The place designated as the end (as of a race or journey). <i>He was nearly exhausted as their destination came into view.</i>

determination	A tendency to move in a fixed direction. <i>Determination of molecular structures.</i>
determinative	A determining or causal element or factor. <i>The determinative or determinant battle.</i>
end	Either of the halves of a sports field or court defended by one team or player. <i>The end managed to hold onto the pass.</i>
epilogue	A short passage added at the end of a literary work. <i>The epilogue told what eventually happened to the main characters.</i>
expiry	The end of a fixed period of time. <i>An expiry date.</i>
final	The final approach of an aircraft to the runway it will be landing on. <i>The final answer.</i>
finale	The closing section of a musical composition. <i>The finale of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony.</i>
finalize	Complete or agree on a finished and definitive version of. <i>Let's finalize the proposal.</i>
finis	The temporal end; the concluding time. <i>The market was up at the finis.</i>
finish	The act of finishing. <i>His best finish in a major tournament was third.</i>
finishing	The act of finishing. <i>The speaker's finishing was greeted with applause.</i>
ineluctable	Unable to be resisted or avoided; inescapable. <i>An ineluctable destiny.</i>
last	On the last occasion before the present previously. <i>I had to miss the last of the movie.</i>
outcome	A phenomenon that follows and is caused by some previous phenomenon. <i>It is the outcome of the vote that counts.</i>
peroration	The concluding section of an oration. <i>He again invoked the theme in an emotional peroration.</i>
result	Produce as a result or residue. <i>Anger may result from an argument.</i>
termination	A word's final syllable or letters or letter, especially when constituting an element in inflection or derivation. <i>The termination of a contract.</i>
