## Nevertheless as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Nevertheless" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “nevertheless” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Despite anything to the contrary (usually preceding a concession.*
- *Despite anything to the contrary (usually following a concession.*
- *In spite of that; notwithstanding; all the same.*

### Synonyms of "Nevertheless" as an adverb (19 Words)

<b>after everything</b>	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time.
<b>all the same</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly).
<a href="#">anyhow</a>	In a careless or haphazard way. <i>I think they re asleep <b>anyhow</b> they re quiet.</i>
<a href="#">anyway</a>	Used to indicate that something happened or will happen in spite of something else. <i>Nobody invited Miss Honey to sit down but she sat down <b>anyway</b>.</i>

<b>but</b>	No more than; only. <i>Choose from a colourful array of mango starfruit and raspberries to name <b>but</b> a few.</i>
<b>even so</b>	To the full extent.
<b>for all that</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent ('whole' is often used informally for 'wholly').
<b>however</b>	In whatever way; regardless of how. <b>However</b> you look at it you can't criticize that.
<b>in any event</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in spite of everything</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in spite of that</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>just the same</b>	Only a moment ago.
<b><u>nonetheless</u></b>	In spite of that; nevertheless. <i>The rally which the government had declared illegal was <b>nonetheless</b> attended by some 6 000.</i>
<b>notwithstanding</b>	Despite anything to the contrary (usually following a concession). <i>I didn't like it. <b>Notwithstanding</b>, I remained calm.</i>
<b><u>regardless</u></b>	In spite of everything; without regard to drawbacks. <i>He carried on <b>regardless</b> of the difficulties.</i>
<b>still</b>	Despite anything to the contrary (usually following a concession). <i>Time stood <b>still</b>.</i>
<b><u>though</u></b>	However. <i>I was hunting for work Jobs were scarce <b>though</b>.</i>
<b>withal</b>	All the same; nevertheless (used when adding something that contrasts with a previous comment). <i>The whole is light and portable and ornamental <b>withal</b>.</i>
<b><u>yet</u></b>	From now into the future for a specified length of time. <i>I know she's alive and I'll find her <b>yet</b>.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Nevertheless" as an adverb

- *While we disliked each other, nevertheless we agreed.*
- *Statements which, although literally true, are nevertheless misleading.*

## Associations of "Nevertheless" (30 Words)

<b>already</b>	Used after a word or phrase to express impatience. <i>It was <b>already</b> past four o'clock.</i>
<b>but</b>	(used at the end of a sentence) though; however. <i>Choose from a colourful array of mango starfruit and raspberries to name <b>but</b> a few.</i>
<b>despite</b>	Contempt; disdain. <i>The theatre only earns my <b>despite</b>.</i>
<b>endurance</b>	The power to withstand hardship or stress. <i>The marathon tests a runner's <b>endurance</b>.</i>
<b>heretofore</b>	Used in negative statement to describe a situation that has existed up to this point or up to the present time. <i>Diseases that <b>heretofore</b> were usually confined to rural areas.</i>
<b>hitherto</b>	Until now or until the point in time under discussion. <i><b>Hitherto</b> part of French West Africa Benin achieved independence in 1960.</i>
<b>however</b>	Despite anything to the contrary (usually preceding a concession). <i>He was hesitant to take the risk <b>however</b> small.</i>
<b>inaction</b>	Lack of action where some is expected or appropriate. <i>Future generations will condemn us for <b>inaction</b>.</i>
<b>inactivity</b>	The state of being inactive; idleness. <i>People are frustrated with government <b>inactivity</b>.</i>
<b>lull</b>	A temporary interval of quiet or lack of activity. <i>The rarity of earthquakes there has <b>lulled</b> people into a false sense of security.</i>
<b>merely</b>	And nothing more. <i>I was <b>merely</b> asking.</i>
<b>motionless</b>	Not in physical motion. <i>An eagle hung almost <b>motionless</b> close to the ground.</i>
<b>nonetheless</b>	In spite of that; nevertheless. <i>The rally which the government had declared illegal was <b>nonetheless</b> attended by some 6 000.</i>
<b>notwithstanding</b>	Despite anything to the contrary (usually preceding a concession). <i>I didn't like it. <b>Notwithstanding</b>, I remained calm.</i>
<b>only</b>	Being the only one single and isolated from others. <i>An <b>only</b> child.</i>
<b>preliminary</b>	A preliminary round in a sporting competition. <i>The discussions were seen as <b>preliminary</b> to the policy paper.</i>

<b>quiescence</b>	Inactivity or dormancy. <i>This method has been shown to induce sleep like <b>quiescence</b> in adult animals.</i>
<b>quiescent</b>	Causing no symptoms. <i>The <b>quiescent</b> melancholy of the town.</i>
<b><u>simply</u></b>	Merely; just. <i><b>Simply</b> complete the application form.</i>
<b>standing</b>	Executed in or initiated from a standing position. <i>Of equal <b>standing</b>.</i>
<b>statics</b>	The branch of mechanics concerned with bodies at rest and forces in equilibrium.
<b><u>stationary</u></b>	Not capable of being moved. <i>A <b>stationary</b> population.</i>
<b>still</b>	Make calm or still. <i><b>Still</b> waters run deep.</i>
<b>suffix</b>	Append something especially as a suffix. <i><b>Suffix</b> words.</i>
<b><u>though</u></b>	However (indicating that a factor qualifies or imposes restrictions on what was said previously). <i>I was hunting for work Jobs were scarce <b>though</b>.</i>
<b>tranquilize</b>	Make calm or still.
<b>unformed</b>	Not having developed or been developed fully. <i>She packed the <b>unformed</b> butter into the mould.</i>
<b>unmoving</b>	Not arousing emotions. <i>This must be the most <b>unmoving</b> performance of Verdi s opera ever recorded.</i>
<b><u>whatever</u></b>	No matter what happens. <i>Give me <b>whatever</b> peaches you don t want.</i>
<b><u>yet</u></b>	Up until the present or a specified or implied time; by now or then. <i>Aren t you ready to go <b>yet</b>.</i>
