Definitions of "Nevertheless" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “nevertheless” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Despite anything to the contrary (usually preceding a concession).*
- *Despite anything to the contrary (usually following a concession).*
- *In spite of that; notwithstanding; all the same.*

Synonyms of "Nevertheless" as an adverb (19 Words)

after everything	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time.
all the same	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’).
anyhow	In a careless or haphazard way. <i>I think they re asleep anyhow they re quiet.</i>
anyway	Used to indicate that something happened or will happen in spite of something else. <i>Nobody invited Miss Honey to sit down but she sat down anyway.</i>

but	No more than; only. <i>Choose from a colourful array of mango starfruit and raspberries to name but a few.</i>
even so	To the full extent.
for all that	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’).
however	In whatever way; regardless of how. However you look at it you can t criticize that.
in any event	To or toward the inside of.
in spite of everything	To or toward the inside of.
in spite of that	To or toward the inside of.
just the same	Only a moment ago.
<u>nonetheless</u>	In spite of that; nevertheless. <i>The rally which the government had declared illegal was nonetheless attended by some 6 000.</i>
notwithstanding	Despite anything to the contrary (usually following a concession). <i>I didn't like it. Notwithstanding, I remained calm.</i>
<u>regardless</u>	In spite of everything; without regard to drawbacks. <i>He carried on regardless of the difficulties.</i>
still	Despite anything to the contrary (usually following a concession). <i>Time stood still.</i>
<u>though</u>	However. <i>I was hunting for work Jobs were scarce though.</i>
withal	All the same; nevertheless (used when adding something that contrasts with a previous comment). <i>The whole is light and portable and ornamental withal.</i>
<u>yet</u>	From now into the future for a specified length of time. <i>I know she s alive and I ll find her yet.</i>

Usage Examples of "Nevertheless" as an adverb

- *While we disliked each other, nevertheless we agreed.*
- *Statements which, although literally true, are nevertheless misleading.*

already	Used after a word or phrase to express impatience. <i>It was already past four o'clock.</i>
but	(used at the end of a sentence) though; however. <i>Choose from a colourful array of mango starfruit and raspberries to name but a few.</i>
despite	Contempt; disdain. <i>The theatre only earns my despite.</i>
endurance	The power to withstand hardship or stress. <i>The marathon tests a runner's endurance.</i>
heretofore	Used in negative statement to describe a situation that has existed up to this point or up to the present time. <i>Diseases that heretofore were usually confined to rural areas.</i>
hitherto	Until now or until the point in time under discussion. <i>Hitherto part of French West Africa Benin achieved independence in 1960.</i>
however	Despite anything to the contrary (usually preceding a concession). <i>He was hesitant to take the risk however small.</i>
inaction	Lack of action where some is expected or appropriate. <i>Future generations will condemn us for inaction.</i>
inactivity	The state of being inactive; idleness. <i>People are frustrated with government inactivity.</i>
lull	A temporary interval of quiet or lack of activity. <i>The rarity of earthquakes there has lulled people into a false sense of security.</i>
merely	And nothing more. <i>I was merely asking.</i>
motionless	Not in physical motion. <i>An eagle hung almost motionless close to the ground.</i>
nonetheless	In spite of that; nevertheless. <i>The rally which the government had declared illegal was nonetheless attended by some 6 000.</i>
notwithstanding	Despite anything to the contrary (usually preceding a concession). <i>I didn't like it. Notwithstanding, I remained calm.</i>
only	Being the only one single and isolated from others. <i>An only child.</i>
preliminary	A preliminary round in a sporting competition. <i>The discussions were seen as preliminary to the policy paper.</i>

quiescence	Inactivity or dormancy. <i>This method has been shown to induce sleep like quiescence in adult animals.</i>
quiescent	Causing no symptoms. <i>The quiescent melancholy of the town.</i>
simply	Merely; just. <i>Simply complete the application form.</i>
standing	Executed in or initiated from a standing position. <i>Of equal standing.</i>
statics	The branch of mechanics concerned with bodies at rest and forces in equilibrium.
stationary	Not capable of being moved. <i>A stationary population.</i>
still	Make calm or still. <i>Still waters run deep.</i>
suffix	Append something especially as a suffix. <i>Suffix words.</i>
though	However (indicating that a factor qualifies or imposes restrictions on what was said previously). <i>I was hunting for work Jobs were scarce though.</i>
tranquilize	Make calm or still.
unformed	Not having developed or been developed fully. <i>She packed the unformed butter into the mould.</i>
unmoving	Not arousing emotions. <i>This must be the most unmoving performance of Verdi s opera ever recorded.</i>
whatever	No matter what happens. <i>Give me whatever peaches you don t want.</i>
yet	Up until the present or a specified or implied time; by now or then. <i>Aren t you ready to go yet.</i>
