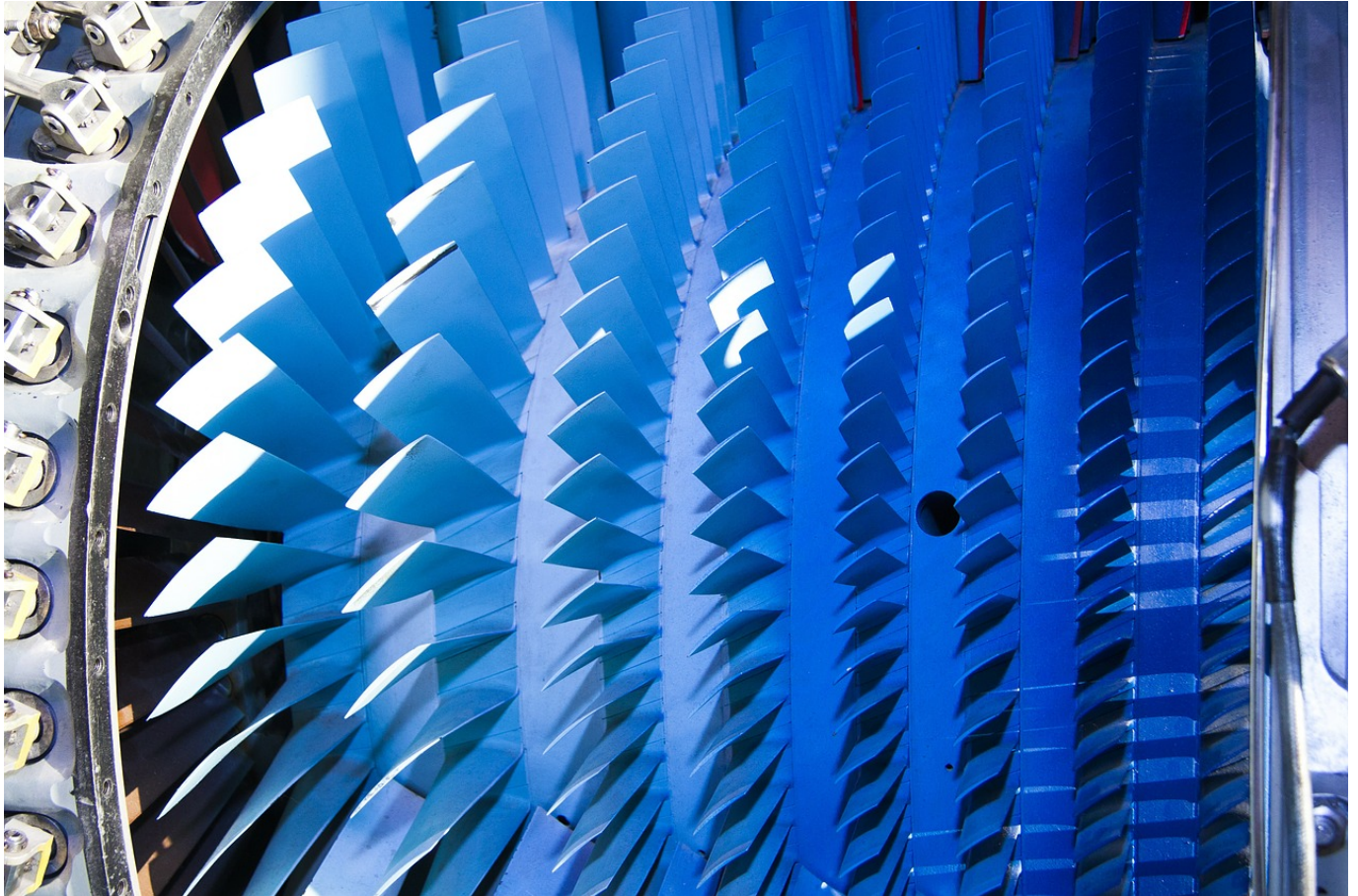

- *A novice in a particular activity or situation.*
- *A person who has recently arrived in a place.*
- *Any new participant in some activity.*
- *A recent arrival.*



Synonyms of "Newcomer" as a noun (26 Words)

alien	Anyone who does not belong in the environment in which they are found. <i>An enemy alien.</i>
apprentice	A beginner. <i>An apprentice electrician.</i>
arrival	Accomplishment of an objective. <i>They awaited her arrival.</i>
beginner	Someone new to a field or activity. <i>A beginner s guide.</i>
entrant	A person or group that enters or takes part in something. <i>New entrants to the country must go though immigration procedures.</i>
fledgeling	Any new participant in some activity.
fledgling	A person or organization that is immature, inexperienced, or underdeveloped. <i>The country s fledgling democracy.</i>

foreigner	A person not belonging to a particular place or group; a stranger or outsider.
freshman	A first-year student at university. <i>We invited the freshmen.</i>
immigrant	A person who comes to a country where they were not born in order to settle there. <i>Immigrant workers.</i>
initiate	A person who has been initiated into an organization or activity. <i>An initiate of the cult.</i>
<u>interloper</u>	Someone who intrudes on the privacy or property of another without permission. <i>Japanese consumers have in the past been unreceptive to foreign interlopers in the cell phone market.</i>
<u>intruder</u>	A person who intrudes, especially into a building with criminal intent. <i>The intruder had pulled out drawers and dumped their contents on the floor.</i>
<u>learner</u>	A person who is learning to drive a motor vehicle and has not yet passed a driving test. <i>A fast learner.</i>
<u>neophyte</u>	A novice in a religious order, or a newly ordained priest. <i>A cast of neophyte actors.</i>
newbie	An inexperienced newcomer to a particular activity.
novice	Someone who has entered a religious order but has not taken final vows. <i>The novice hurdles.</i>
<u>outsider</u>	A contestant (human or animal) not considered to have a good chance to win. <i>She felt that his friends despised her as an outsider.</i>
parvenu	A person of humble origin who has gained wealth, influence, or celebrity. <i>The political inexperience of a parvenu.</i>
probationer	An offender on probation.
raw recruit	Informal terms for nakedness.
settler	A person who moves with a group of others to live in a new country or area. <i>The early European settlers in America were often fleeing from religious persecution.</i>
<u>starter</u>	The pitcher who starts the game. <i>Consumers upgrading from a regular mobile phone to a starter smartphone.</i>
<u>stranger</u>	A person whom one does not know or with whom one is not familiar. <i>He is no stranger to controversy.</i>
<u>trainee</u>	Someone who is being trained. <i>Trainee solicitors.</i>

Associations of "Newcomer" (30 Words)

amateur	Lacking professional skill or expertise. <i>An amateur painter.</i>
appetizer	Food or drink to stimulate the appetite (usually served before a meal or as the first course). <i>The afternoon games served as an appetizer for the evening's heavyweight clash between Borussia Dortmund and Bayern Munich.</i>
<u>apprentice</u>	Employ someone as an apprentice. <i>She apprenticed with midwives in San Francisco.</i>
<u>beginner</u>	Someone new to a field or activity. <i>A beginner's guide.</i>
entrant	Someone who enters. <i>The company is a new entrant into an established market.</i>
<u>exercising</u>	The activity of exerting your muscles in various ways to keep fit. <i>He did some exercising.</i>
<u>fledgling</u>	(of a young bird) having acquired its flight feathers. <i>A fledgling skier.</i>
<u>founder</u>	A worker who makes metal castings. <i>An iron founder.</i>
freshen	Make fresh again. <i>The yachts picked up a freshening breeze.</i>
freshman	A first-year undergraduate. <i>A freshman senator.</i>
grader	A wheeled machine for levelling the ground, especially in making roads. <i>A first grader.</i>
laity	In Christianity, members of a religious community that do not have the priestly responsibilities of ordained clergy.
layman	A non-ordained male member of a Church. <i>The book seems well suited to the interested layman.</i>
<u>learner</u>	Works for an expert to learn a trade. <i>A fast learner.</i>
<u>meal</u>	The food eaten during a meal. <i>The evening meal.</i>
<u>mere</u>	Being nothing more than specified. <i>Questions that cannot be answered by mere mortals.</i>

neophyte	A new convert being taught the principles of Christianity by a catechist. <i>Four day cooking classes are offered to neophytes and experts.</i>
nestling	A young person of either sex. <i>Cuckoo nestlings.</i>
newbie	Any new participant in some activity.
novice	Someone who has entered a religious order but has not taken final vows. <i>The novice hurdles.</i>
prentice	Works for an expert to learn a trade. <i>A tailor s prentice.</i>
rookie	An awkward and inexperienced youth. <i>A rookie cop.</i>
salad	A cold dish of various mixtures of raw or cooked vegetables, usually seasoned with oil, vinegar, or other dressing and sometimes accompanied by meat, fish, or other ingredients. <i>Bowls of salad.</i>
sophomore	Used of the second year in United States high school or college. <i>Their sophomore year in college.</i>
soup	A substance or mixture regarded as resembling soup in appearance or consistency. <i>The waves and the water beyond have become a thick brown soup.</i>
starter	A railway signal controlling the starting of trains from a station or other location. <i>To make sourdough you need a starter.</i>
student	A school pupil. <i>Student loans.</i>
tutorial	Relating to a tutor or a tutor's tuition. <i>Online tutorials and reference guides.</i>
tyro	Someone new to a field or activity.
unpracticed	Not having had extensive practice.
