<a href="#">latest</a>	In the current fashion or style. <i>Have you heard the <b>latest</b>.</i>
<a href="#">modern</a>	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i><b>Modern</b> history.</i>
<b>modish</b>	In the current fashion or style. <i>It seems sad that such a scholar should feel compelled to use this <b>modish</b> jargon.</i>

<b>new</b>	Beginning anew and in a transformed way. <i>They are <b>newly</b> married.</i>
<b>newfangled</b>	Gratuitously new. <i>I ve no time for such <b>newfangled</b> nonsense.</i>
<b>novelty</b>	Cheap showy jewelry or ornament on clothing. <i>In 1914 air travel was still a <b>novelty</b>.</i>
<b>premonitory</b>	Warning of future misfortune.
<b>presently</b>	At the present time; now. <i>This will be examined in more detail <b>presently</b>.</i>
<b>recency</b>	The property of having happened or appeared not long ago.
<b>recent</b>	Of the immediate past or just previous to the present time. <i>A <b>recent</b> edition of the newspaper.</i>
<b>recently</b>	At a recent time; not long ago. <i>Until <b>recently</b> we had a female doctor.</i>
<b>refreshing</b>	Welcome or stimulating because new or different. <i>It makes a <b>refreshing</b> change to be able to write about something nice.</i>
<b>shortly</b>	For a short time. <i>The new database will <b>shortly</b> be available for consultation.</i>
<b>stylish</b>	Fashionably elegant and sophisticated. <i>A <b>stylish</b> cocktail bar.</i>
<b>transfigure</b>	Change completely the nature or appearance of. <i>The world is made luminous and is <b>transfigured</b>.</i>
<b>ultramodern</b>	Extremely modern. <i>Dadism and <b>ultramodern</b> art.</i>
<b>unconventional</b>	Not conventional or conformist. <i><b>Unconventional</b> life styles.</i>
<b>unfamiliar</b>	Not known or well known. <i>He seems <b>unfamiliar</b> with recent research on this topic.</i>
<b>unveil</b>	Remove the veil from. <i>Women must not <b>unveil</b> themselves in public in some religious societies.</i>
<b>whereabouts</b>	Where or approximately where. <i><b>Whereabouts</b> do you come from.</i>
