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Associations of "Next to" (30 Words)

abut	Touch or lean on. <i>A park abutting on an area of waste land.</i>
accompanying	Following or accompanying as a consequence. <i>The accompanying documentation.</i>
adjacent	Next to or adjoining something else. <i>Adjacent rooms.</i>
after	At a later or future time afterwards. <i>Two hours after that.</i>
afterthought	Something that is thought of or added later. <i>The garage was an afterthought.</i>
afterward	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>It didn't happen until afterward.</i>
afterwards	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>The offender was arrested shortly afterwards.</i>
alongside	Side by side.
contiguous	Very close or connected in space or time. <i>The Southern Ocean is contiguous with the Atlantic.</i>
ensuing	Following immediately and as a result of what went before. <i>She lost track of one of her children during the ensuing chaos.</i>
following	Immediately following in time or order. <i>Tried to outrun the following footsteps.</i>
future	A verb tense that expresses actions or states in the future. <i>His future wife.</i>
hereafter	After death. <i>This court is in no way prejudging any such defence which may hereafter be raised.</i>

incoming	(of a communication) being received rather than sent. <i>Keep an account of your incomings and outgoings.</i>
later	At a time in the near future; soon or afterwards. <i>I ll see you later.</i>
lateral	Involving lateral thinking. <i>The plant takes up water through its lateral roots.</i>
laterally	In a way that involves lateral thinking. <i>Use slide steps to move laterally.</i>
medial	(of a speech sound) in the middle of a word. <i>A medial consonant.</i>
posterior	Coming after in time or order; later. <i>The posterior part of the gut.</i>
posterity	All future generations of people. <i>The victims names are recorded for posterity.</i>
preliminary	A preliminary round in a sporting competition. <i>A preliminary draft.</i>
purlieu	A tract on the border of a forest, especially one earlier included in it and still partly subject to forest laws. <i>The photogenic purlieus of Cambridge.</i>
sequent	In regular succession without gaps. <i>Some of the inferences are not sequent on the premises.</i>
shortly	In a curt, abrupt and discourteous manner. <i>To put it shortly.</i>
subsequence	Something that follows something else. <i>An affair which appeared in due subsequence in the newspapers.</i>
subsequent	Following in time or order. <i>The theory was developed subsequent to the earthquake of 1906.</i>
subsequently	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>The work was accepted for inclusion in the Paris Salon of 1880 and was subsequently sold to an important collector.</i>
successively	In proper order or sequence. <i>Three letters of successively decreasing length.</i>
superimpose	Place or lay (one thing) over another, typically so that both are still evident. <i>Can you superimpose the two images.</i>
