


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Usage Examples of "Nicely" as an adverb

Associations of "Nicely" (30 Words)

affable	Friendly, good-natured, or easy to talk to. An affable smile.
amiable	Diffusing warmth and friendliness. The amiable young man greeted me enthusiastically.
<u>benign</u>	Not harmful to the environment. His benign but firm manner.
benignity	An act of kindness. <i>His air of benignity.</i>



<u>bounteous</u>	Given or giving freely. The earth yields a bounteous harvest.
<u>chivalrous</u>	Courteous and gallant, especially towards women (typically used of a man or his behaviour. Shall I be chivalrous and offer you my coat.
<u>civility</u>	Formal politeness and courtesy in behaviour or speech. I hope we can treat each other with civility and respect.
<u>congenial</u>	(of a thing) pleasant or agreeable because suited to one's taste or inclination. A congenial atmosphere to work in.
<u>courteous</u>	Exhibiting courtesy and politeness. She was courteous and obliging to all.
<u>courtesy</u>	A courteous or respectful or considerate act. A courtesy car.
couth	Good manners; refinement. <i>He has no couth no brains and doesn t know the meaning of the word diplomacy.</i>
curtsy	Perform a curtsy. She bobbed a curtsy to him.
<u>decent</u>	Decently clothed. People need decent homes.
<u>delightful</u>	Causing delight; charming. The comedy was delightful .
<u>friendliness</u>	A feeling of liking for another person; enjoyment in their company. I was overwhelmed by the friendliness of the people here.
friendly	(of a person) on good or affectionate terms. I was friendly with one of the local farmers.
<u>generosity</u>	The quality of being kind and generous. I was overwhelmed by the generosity of friends and neighbours.
goodness	Moral excellence or admirableness. A belief in the basic goodness of mankind.
<u>gracious</u>	A polite epithet used of royalty or their acts. A gracious hostess.
humbleness	The state of being humble and unimportant.
innocuous	Not causing disapproval. It was an innocuous remark.



intriguing	Capable of arousing interest or curiosity. <i>Our team came up with some most intriguing finds.</i>
<u>kindly</u>	In a kind manner or out of kindness. <i>Kindly criticism.</i>
kindness	A kind act. <i>He thanked them for their kindness and support.</i>
<u>pleasant</u>	Giving a sense of happy satisfaction or enjoyment. We had a pleasant evening together.
pleasantness	The quality of giving pleasure. The pleasantness of a cool breeze on a hot summer day.
<u>polite</u>	Showing regard for others in manners, speech, behavior, etc. <i>They thought she was wrong but were too</i> polite <i>to say so.</i>
politely	In a polite manner. <i>He waited politely for me to ask questions.</i>
respectfully	With deference and respect. The butler bowed respectfully to them both.
<u>unassuming</u>	Not pretentious or arrogant; modest. <i>He was an unassuming and kindly man.</i>
