

## Associations of "Nicely" (30 Words)

affable	Friendly, good-natured, or easy to talk to. An <b>affable</b> smile.
amiable	Diffusing warmth and friendliness. The <b>amiable</b> young man greeted me enthusiastically.
<u>benign</u>	Not harmful to the environment. His <b>benign</b> but firm manner.
benignity	An act of kindness. <i>His air of <b>benignity</b>.</i>



<u>bounteous</u>	Given or giving freely. The earth yields a <b>bounteous</b> harvest.
<u>chivalrous</u>	Courteous and gallant, especially towards women (typically used of a man or his behaviour. Shall I be <b>chivalrous</b> and offer you my coat.
<u>civility</u>	Formal politeness and courtesy in behaviour or speech. I hope we can treat each other with <b>civility</b> and respect.
<u>congenial</u>	(of a thing) pleasant or agreeable because suited to one's taste or inclination. A <b>congenial</b> atmosphere to work in.
<u>courteous</u>	Exhibiting courtesy and politeness. She was <b>courteous</b> and obliging to all.
<u>courtesy</u>	A courteous or respectful or considerate act. A <b>courtesy</b> car.
couth	Good manners; refinement. <i>He has no <b>couth</b> no brains and doesn t know the meaning of the word diplomacy.</i>
curtsy	Perform a curtsy. She bobbed a <b>curtsy</b> to him.
<u>decent</u>	Decently clothed. People need <b>decent</b> homes.
<u>delightful</u>	Causing delight; charming. The comedy was <b>delightful</b> .
<u>friendliness</u>	A feeling of liking for another person; enjoyment in their company. I was overwhelmed by the <b>friendliness</b> of the people here.
friendly	(of a person) on good or affectionate terms. I was <b>friendly</b> with one of the local farmers.
<u>generosity</u>	The quality of being kind and generous. I was overwhelmed by the <b>generosity</b> of friends and neighbours.
goodness	Moral excellence or admirableness. A belief in the basic <b>goodness</b> of mankind.
<u>gracious</u>	A polite epithet used of royalty or their acts. A <b>gracious</b> hostess.
humbleness	The state of being humble and unimportant.
innocuous	Not causing disapproval. It was an <b>innocuous</b> remark.



intriguing	Capable of arousing interest or curiosity. <i>Our team came up with some most <b>intriguing</b> finds.</i>
<u>kindly</u>	In a kind manner or out of kindness. <i>Kindly criticism.</i>
kindness	A kind act. <i>He thanked them for their <b>kindness</b> and support.</i>
<u>pleasant</u>	Giving a sense of happy satisfaction or enjoyment. We had a <b>pleasant</b> evening together.
pleasantness	The quality of giving pleasure. The <b>pleasantness</b> of a cool breeze on a hot summer day.
<u>polite</u>	Showing regard for others in manners, speech, behavior, etc. <i>They thought she was wrong but were too</i> <b>polite</b> <i>to say so.</i>
politely	In a polite manner. <i>He waited <b>politely</b> for me to ask questions.</i>
respectfully	With deference and respect. The butler bowed <b>respectfully</b> to them both.
<u>unassuming</u>	Not pretentious or arrogant; modest. <i>He was an <b>unassuming</b> and kindly man.</i>
