## Synonyms of "Nicely" as an adverb (15 Words)

- acceptably** In an adequate or satisfactory way.  
*This design performed **acceptably** in testing.*
- agreeably** In an enjoyable manner.  
*An **agreeably** warm day.*
- amusingly** Used to express amusement at an event or situation.  
*His exquisite manners contrasted **amusingly** with our rude ways.*
- attractively** In a beautiful manner.  
*I like to dress **attractively**.*
- beautifully** In a beautiful manner.  
*Her face was **beautifully** made up.*
- courteously** In a polite manner.
- delightfully** In a manner that causes great pleasure; charmingly.  
*A **delightfully** illustrated account.*

<b>enjoyably</b>	In a way that gives delight or pleasure. <i>This is an <b>enjoyably</b> dark thriller with a wicked atmosphere.</i>
<b>fittingly</b>	In a way that is suitable or appropriate under the circumstances. <i>Perhaps <b>fittingly</b> Scotland has its share of outdoor clothing firms.</i>
<b>pleasantly</b>	In an enjoyable manner. <i>He smiled <b>pleasantly</b> and extended his arm for me to pass.</i>
<b>pleasingly</b>	In a satisfying or appealing manner. <i>The music has little depth but is conveyed <b>pleasingly</b>.</i>
<b>politely</b>	In a respectful and considerate manner. <i>The policeman answered <b>politely</b> Now look here lady.</i>
<b>satisfactorily</b>	In a way that fulfils expectations or needs; acceptably. <i>The plan has not worked <b>satisfactorily</b>.</i>
<b>satisfyingly</b>	In a way that gives fulfilment or the pleasure associated with this. <i>She neatly and <b>satisfyingly</b> ties up the loose ends in the story.</i>
<b>well</b>	Often used as a combining form in a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>They lived <b>well</b> and were generous with their money.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Nicely" as an adverb

- *Say goodbye nicely to Miss Sandra.*
- *We're doing very nicely now.*
- *Nicely dressed in flowered cotton.*

- affable** Friendly, good-natured, or easy to talk to.  
*An **affable** smile.*
- amiable** Diffusing warmth and friendliness.  
*The **amiable** young man greeted me enthusiastically.*
- benign** Not harmful to the environment.  
*His **benign** but firm manner.*
- benignity** An act of kindness.  
*His air of **benignity**.*

<b><u>bounteous</u></b>	Given or giving freely. <i>The earth yields a <b>bounteous</b> harvest.</i>
<b><u>chivalrous</u></b>	Courteous and gallant, especially towards women (typically used of a man or his behaviour). <i>Shall I be <b>chivalrous</b> and offer you my coat.</i>
<b><u>civility</u></b>	Formal politeness and courtesy in behaviour or speech. <i>I hope we can treat each other with <b>civility</b> and respect.</i>
<b><u>congenial</u></b>	(of a thing) pleasant or agreeable because suited to one's taste or inclination. <i>A <b>congenial</b> atmosphere to work in.</i>
<b><u>courteous</u></b>	Exhibiting courtesy and politeness. <i>She was <b>courteous</b> and obliging to all.</i>
<b><u>courtesy</u></b>	A courteous or respectful or considerate act. <i>A <b>courtesy</b> car.</i>
<b>couth</b>	Good manners; refinement. <i>He has no <b>couth</b> no brains and doesn't know the meaning of the word diplomacy.</i>
<b>curtsy</b>	Perform a curtsy. <i>She bobbed a <b>curtsy</b> to him.</i>
<b><u>decent</u></b>	Decently clothed. <i>People need <b>decent</b> homes.</i>
<b><u>delightful</u></b>	Causing delight; charming. <i>The comedy was <b>delightful</b>.</i>
<b><u>friendliness</u></b>	A feeling of liking for another person; enjoyment in their company. <i>I was overwhelmed by the <b>friendliness</b> of the people here.</i>
<b>friendly</b>	(of a person) on good or affectionate terms. <i>I was <b>friendly</b> with one of the local farmers.</i>
<b><u>generosity</u></b>	The quality of being kind and generous. <i>I was overwhelmed by the <b>generosity</b> of friends and neighbours.</i>
<b>goodness</b>	Moral excellence or admirableness. <i>A belief in the basic <b>goodness</b> of mankind.</i>
<b><u>gracious</u></b>	A polite epithet used of royalty or their acts. <i>A <b>gracious</b> hostess.</i>
<b>humbleness</b>	The state of being humble and unimportant.
<b>innocuous</b>	Not causing disapproval. <i>It was an <b>innocuous</b> remark.</i>

<b>intriguing</b>	Capable of arousing interest or curiosity. <i>Our team came up with some most <b>intriguing</b> finds.</i>
<b>kindly</b>	In a kind manner or out of kindness. <i><b>Kindly</b> criticism.</i>
<b>kindness</b>	A kind act. <i>He thanked them for their <b>kindness</b> and support.</i>
<b>pleasant</b>	Giving a sense of happy satisfaction or enjoyment. <i>We had a <b>pleasant</b> evening together.</i>
<b>pleasantness</b>	The quality of giving pleasure. <i>The <b>pleasantness</b> of a cool breeze on a hot summer day.</i>
<b>polite</b>	Showing regard for others in manners, speech, behavior, etc. <i>They thought she was wrong but were too <b>polite</b> to say so.</i>
<b>politely</b>	In a polite manner. <i>He waited <b>politely</b> for me to ask questions.</i>
<b>respectfully</b>	With deference and respect. <i>The butler bowed <b>respectfully</b> to them both.</i>
<b>unassuming</b>	Not pretentious or arrogant; modest. <i>He was an <b>unassuming</b> and kindly man.</i>
