Synonyms of "Nicely" as an adverb (15 Words)

acceptably	In an adequate or satisfactory way. <i>This design performed acceptably in testing.</i>
agreeably	In an enjoyable manner. <i>An agreeably warm day.</i>
amusingly	Used to express amusement at an event or situation. <i>His exquisite manners contrasted amusingly with our rude ways.</i>
attractively	In a beautiful manner. <i>I like to dress attractively.</i>
beautifully	In a beautiful manner. <i>Her face was beautifully made up.</i>
courteously	In a polite manner.
delightfully	In a manner that causes great pleasure; charmingly. <i>A delightfully illustrated account.</i>

enjoyably	In a way that gives delight or pleasure. <i>This is an enjoyably dark thriller with a wicked atmosphere.</i>
fittingly	In a way that is suitable or appropriate under the circumstances. <i>Perhaps fittingly Scotland has its share of outdoor clothing firms.</i>
pleasantly	In an enjoyable manner. <i>He smiled pleasantly and extended his arm for me to pass.</i>
pleasingly	In a satisfying or appealing manner. <i>The music has little depth but is conveyed pleasingly.</i>
politely	In a respectful and considerate manner. <i>The policeman answered politely Now look here lady.</i>
satisfactorily	In a way that fulfils expectations or needs; acceptably. <i>The plan has not worked satisfactorily.</i>
satisfyingly	In a way that gives fulfilment or the pleasure associated with this. <i>She neatly and satisfyingly ties up the loose ends in the story.</i>
well	Often used as a combining form in a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>They lived well and were generous with their money.</i>



Usage Examples of "Nicely" as an adverb

- *Say goodbye nicely to Miss Sandra.*
- *We're doing very nicely now.*
- *Nicely dressed in flowered cotton.*

- benign** Not harmful to the environment.

- benignity** An act of kindness.
*His air of **benignity**.*

<u>bounteous</u>	Given or giving freely. <i>The earth yields a bounteous harvest.</i>
<u>chivalrous</u>	Courteous and gallant, especially towards women (typically used of a man or his behaviour). <i>Shall I be chivalrous and offer you my coat.</i>
<u>civility</u>	Formal politeness and courtesy in behaviour or speech. <i>I hope we can treat each other with civility and respect.</i>
<u>congenial</u>	(of a thing) pleasant or agreeable because suited to one's taste or inclination. <i>A congenial atmosphere to work in.</i>
<u>courteous</u>	Exhibiting courtesy and politeness. <i>She was courteous and obliging to all.</i>
<u>courtesy</u>	A courteous or respectful or considerate act. <i>A courtesy car.</i>
couth	Good manners; refinement. <i>He has no couth no brains and doesn't know the meaning of the word diplomacy.</i>
curtsy	Perform a curtsy. <i>She bobbed a curtsy to him.</i>
<u>decent</u>	Decently clothed. <i>People need decent homes.</i>
<u>delightful</u>	Causing delight; charming. <i>The comedy was delightful.</i>
<u>friendliness</u>	A feeling of liking for another person; enjoyment in their company. <i>I was overwhelmed by the friendliness of the people here.</i>
friendly	(of a person) on good or affectionate terms. <i>I was friendly with one of the local farmers.</i>
<u>generosity</u>	The quality of being kind and generous. <i>I was overwhelmed by the generosity of friends and neighbours.</i>
goodness	Moral excellence or admirableness. <i>A belief in the basic goodness of mankind.</i>
<u>gracious</u>	A polite epithet used of royalty or their acts. <i>A gracious hostess.</i>
humbleness	The state of being humble and unimportant.
innocuous	Not causing disapproval. <i>It was an innocuous remark.</i>

intriguing	Capable of arousing interest or curiosity. <i>Our team came up with some most intriguing finds.</i>
kindly	In a kind manner or out of kindness. <i>Kindly criticism.</i>
kindness	A kind act. <i>He thanked them for their kindness and support.</i>
pleasant	Giving a sense of happy satisfaction or enjoyment. <i>We had a pleasant evening together.</i>
pleasantness	The quality of giving pleasure. <i>The pleasantness of a cool breeze on a hot summer day.</i>
polite	Showing regard for others in manners, speech, behavior, etc. <i>They thought she was wrong but were too polite to say so.</i>
politely	In a polite manner. <i>He waited politely for me to ask questions.</i>
respectfully	With deference and respect. <i>The butler bowed respectfully to them both.</i>
unassuming	Not pretentious or arrogant; modest. <i>He was an unassuming and kindly man.</i>
