- charm** A characteristic property of certain subatomic particles specifically charm quarks charm antiquarks and hadrons containing these expressed as a quantum number.

- civility** Polite remarks used in formal conversation.  
*I hope we can treat each other with **civility** and respect.*

<b>compassion</b>	The humane quality of understanding the suffering of others and wanting to do something about it. <i>The victims should be treated with <b>compassion</b>.</i>
<b>cordiality</b>	A cordial disposition. A polite remark or considerate act.
<a href="#"><u>courtesy</u></a>	<i>Links to the manufacturers websites are provided as a <b>courtesy</b> to the user.</i>
<b>decency</b>	Behaviour or appearance that avoids impropriety or immodesty. <i>A loose dress rather too low cut for <b>decency</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>friendliness</u></a>	A feeling of liking for another person; enjoyment in their company. <i>I was overwhelmed by the <b>friendliness</b> of the people here.</i>
<b>geniality</b>	A disposition to be friendly and approachable (easy to talk to). <i>He was endowed with <b>geniality</b> and good humour.</i>
<b>gentility</b>	Social superiority as demonstrated by polite and respectable manners, behaviour, or appearances. <i>Her grandmother's pretensions to <b>gentility</b>.</i>
<b>kindness</b>	The quality of being friendly, generous, and considerate. <i>It would be a <b>kindness</b> on your part to invite her.</i>
<b>pleasantness</b>	The feeling caused by agreeable stimuli; one pole of a continuum of states of feeling. <i>The <b>pleasantness</b> of a cool breeze on a hot summer day.</i>
<b>politeness</b>	A courteous manner that respects accepted social usage. <i>The daily <b>politenesses</b> of pleases and thank yous.</i>
<a href="#"><u>refinement</u></a>	The quality of excellence in thought and manners and taste. <i>The <b>refinement</b> of Hellenistic art.</i>
<b>respectability</b>	Honorableness by virtue of being respectable and having a good reputation. <i>Provincial notions of <b>respectability</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>subtlety</u></a>	The quality or state of being subtle. <i>You had to admire the <b>subtlety</b> of the distinctions he drew.</i>
<a href="#"><u>sympathy</u></a>	A relation of affinity or harmony between people; whatever affects one correspondingly affects the other. <i>I have some <b>sympathy</b> for this view.</i>
<b>understanding</b>	The ability to understand something; comprehension. <i>I knew I could count on his <b>understanding</b>.</i>
<b>warmth</b>	Enthusiasm, affection, or kindness. <i>She smiled with real <b>warmth</b>.</i>

- bounteous** Generously given or giving; bountiful.  
*The earth yields a **bounteous** harvest.*
- chivalrous** Being attentive to women like an ideal knight.  
*The concept of **chivalrous** combat.*

<b>civility</b>	The act of showing regard for others. <i>I hope we can treat each other with <b>civility</b> and respect.</i>
<b>congenial</b>	Suitable to your needs- T.L.Peacock. <i>A <b>congenial</b> atmosphere to work in.</i>
<b>courteous</b>	Characterized by courtesy and gracious good manners. <i>If a man be gracious and <b>courteous</b> to strangers it shows he is a citizen of the world.</i>
<b>courtesy</b>	(especially of transport) supplied free of charge to people who are already paying for another service. <i>A <b>courtesy</b> car.</i>
<b>couth</b>	Cultured, refined, and well mannered. <i>He has no <b>couth</b> no brains and doesn't know the meaning of the word diplomacy.</i>
<b>curtsy</b>	Make a curtsy usually done only by girls and women as a sign of respect. <i>She bobbed a <b>curtsy</b> to him.</i>
<b>decent</b>	Decently clothed. <i>A <b>decent</b> clean living individual.</i>
<b>delightful</b>	Causing delight; charming. <i>A <b>delightful</b> surprise.</i>
<b>friendliness</b>	The quality of being friendly; affability. <i>I was overwhelmed by the <b>friendliness</b> of the people here.</i>
<b>friendly</b>	Denoting something that is adapted for or is not harmful to a specified thing. <i>A government <b>friendly</b> to our interests.</i>
<b>generosity</b>	The trait of being willing to give your money or time. <i>Diners certainly cannot complain about the <b>generosity</b> of portions.</i>
<b>goodness</b>	Moral excellence or admirableness. <i>A belief in the basic <b>goodness</b> of mankind.</i>
<b>gracious</b>	Characterized by kindness and warm courtesy especially of a king to his subjects. <i><b>Gracious</b> even to unexpected visitors.</i>
<b>humbleness</b>	A humble feeling.
<b>innocuous</b>	Lacking intent or capacity to injure. <i>It was an <b>innocuous</b> question.</i>
<b>intriguing</b>	Arousing one's curiosity or interest; fascinating. <i>The food is an <b>intriguing</b> combination of German and French.</i>

- kindly** Kind, warm-hearted, or gentle.  
*Would you **kindly** explain what you re talking about.*
- kindness** The quality of being friendly, generous, and considerate.  
*It would be a **kindness** on your part to invite her.*
- pleasant** Giving a sense of happy satisfaction or enjoyment.  
***Pleasant** sensations.*
- pleasantness** The quality of giving pleasure.  
*The **pleasantness** of a cool breeze on a hot summer day.*
- polite** Marked by refinement in taste and manners.  
*The picture outraged **polite** society.*
- politely** In a respectful and considerate manner.  
*The policeman answered **politely** Now look here lady.*
- respectfully** In a respectful manner.  
*The butler bowed **respectfully** to them both.*
- unassuming** Not pretentious or arrogant; modest.  
*He was an **unassuming** and kindly man.*
