## Associations of "No matter" (30 Words)

<b>abnegation</b>	The denial and rejection of a doctrine or belief. <i><b>Abnegation</b> of political power.</i>
<b>apophasis</b>	Mentioning something by saying it will not be mentioned.
<b><u>contradict</u></b>	Be in contradiction with. <i>The survey appears to <b>contradict</b> the industry s claims.</i>
<b>controvert</b>	Argue about (something). <i>The views in the article have been <b>controverted</b>.</i>
<b>deniable</b>	Capable of being denied or contradicted. <i>The government did agree to play a limited and <b>deniable</b> role in the rebellion.</i>
<b><u>denial</u></b>	Refusal to acknowledge an unacceptable truth or emotion or to admit it into consciousness, used as a defence mechanism. <i>The <b>denial</b> of insurance to people with certain medical conditions.</i>
<b><u>deny</u></b>	Deny oneself something restrain especially from indulging in some pleasure. <i>The servants are ordered to <b>deny</b> him.</i>
<b><u>disallow</u></b>	Command against. <i>He was offside and the goal was <b>disallowed</b>.</i>
<b><u>disavow</u></b>	Refuse to acknowledge; disclaim knowledge of; responsibility for, or association with. <i>Her husband <b>disavowed</b> her after 30 years of marriage and six children.</i>
<b>disavowal</b>	The denial of any responsibility or support for something; repudiation. <i>His <b>disavowal</b> of his previous writings.</i>
<b>disclaim</b>	Make a disclaimer about. <i>He <b>disclaimed</b> any responsibility.</i>
<b>gainsay</b>	Take exception to. <i>None could <b>gainsay</b> her.</i>

<b>impugn</b>	Dispute the truth, validity, or honesty of (a statement or motive); call into question. <i>The father does not <b>impugn</b> her capacity as a good mother.</i>
<b>inadmissible</b>	Not deserving to be admitted. <i><b>Inadmissible</b> evidence.</i>
<b>interdict</b>	Impede (an enemy force), especially by bombing lines of communication or supply. <i>Society will never <b>interdict</b> sex.</i>
<b>negate</b>	Prove negative; show to be false. <i>Alcohol <b>negates</b> the effects of the drug.</i>
<b>nullify</b>	Show to be invalid. <i>Insulin can block the release of the hormone and thereby <b>nullify</b> the effects of training.</i>
<b>objection</b>	The action of challenging or disagreeing with something. <i>His view is open to <b>objection</b>.</i>
<b>perjure</b>	Knowingly tell an untruth in a legal court and render oneself guilty of perjury. <i>She admitted that she had <b>perjured</b> herself.</i>
<b>rebut</b>	Prove to be false or incorrect. <i>He had to <b>rebut</b> charges of acting for the convenience of his political friends.</i>
<b>rebuttal</b>	An instance of rebutting evidence or an accusation.
<b>refusal</b>	A message refusing to accept something that is offered. <i>An appeal against the <b>refusal</b> of a licence.</i>
<b>refuse</b>	Refuse to accept. <i>Again the horse <b>refused</b> his nostrils flaring with fear.</i>
<b>refutable</b>	Able to be refuted.
<b>refutation</b>	The speech act of answering an attack on your assertions. <i>His <b>refutation</b> of the charges was short and persuasive.</i>
<b>refute</b>	Prove (a statement or theory) to be wrong or false; disprove. <i>These claims have not been convincingly <b>refuted</b>.</i>
<b>reject</b>	The person or thing that is rejected or set aside as inferior in quality. <i>Black people were often <b>rejected</b> by country clubs.</i>
<b>rejection</b>	An immunological response that refuses to accept substances or organisms that are recognized as foreign. <i>His proposals were met with <b>rejection</b>.</i>

**repudiate** Refuse to fulfil or discharge (an agreement, obligation, or debt).  
*Breach of a condition gives the other party the right to **repudiate** a contract.*

**repudiation** Refusal to acknowledge or pay a debt or honor a contract (especially by public authorities).  
*The **repudiation** of the debt by the city.*
