Associations of "Non negotiable" (30 Words)

alienable	Transferable to another owner. <i>It was in the interest of the public and the landowners to make land freely alienable.</i>
arbitration	The hearing and determination of a dispute by an impartial referee agreed to by both parties (often used to settle disputes between labor and management. <i>They submitted their disagreement to arbitration.</i>
arbitrator	An independent person or body officially appointed to settle a dispute. <i>The arbitrator s authority derived from the consent of the disputants.</i>
argue	Exchange or express diverging or opposite views, typically in a heated or angry way. <i>It stands to reason she argued.</i>
argument	An independent variable associated with a function or proposition and determining its value For example in the expression $y = F(x)$ the arguments of the function F are x and x and the value is y . <i>It was a strong argument that his hypothesis was true.</i>
bargain	Negotiate the terms of an exchange. <i>His determination not to bargain away any of the province s economic powers.</i>
bargaining	The negotiation of the terms of a transaction or agreement.
chaffer	Haggle about the terms of an agreement or price of something. <i>I chaffered in the bazaars for objects I wanted.</i>
chat	Birds having a chattering call. <i>You can have four simultaneous chats online at once.</i>
consult	An act of consulting a professional a consultation. <i>The government must consult with interested bodies.</i>
contentiousness	An inclination to be quarrelsome and contentious.

debate	Discuss the pros and cons of an issue. <i>He debated whether he should leave the matter alone or speak to her.</i>
dialogue	Provide a film or play with a dialogue. <i>Interfaith dialogue.</i>
discourse	An extended communication (often interactive) dealing with some particular topic. <i>An imagined discourse between two people.</i>
discuss	Speak with others about something talk something over in detail have a discussion. <i>In Chapter Six I discuss problems that arise in applying Darwin s ideas.</i>
disputation	The formal presentation of a stated proposition and the opposition to it (usually followed by a vote). <i>Promoting consensus rather than disputation.</i>
finalize	Complete or agree on a finished and definitive version of. <i>Let s finalize the proposal.</i>
forum	A meeting or medium where ideas and views on a particular issue can be exchanged. <i>We hope these pages act as a forum for debate.</i>
haggle	An instance of intense argument (as in bargaining). <i>An inevitable and lengthy haggle over compensation.</i>
inexpensive	Relatively low in price or charging low prices. <i>Inexpensive family restaurants.</i>
interlocutor	A person who takes part in a dialogue or conversation.
interlocutory	Consisting of dialogue. <i>An interlocutory injunction.</i>
mediate	Connected indirectly through another person or thing involving an intermediate agency. <i>Efforts to mediate a peaceful resolution of the conflict.</i>
negotiate	Transfer (a cheque, bill, or other document) to the legal ownership of another person, who thus becomes entitled to any benefit. <i>They negotiated the sale of the house.</i>
negotiation	The activity or business of negotiating an agreement; coming to terms. <i>Negotiations between unions and employers.</i>
parley	A negotiation between enemies. <i>They disagreed over whether to parley with the enemy.</i>

recitative	Musical declamation of the kind usual in the narrative and dialogue parts of opera and oratorio, sung in the rhythm of ordinary speech with many words on the same note. <i>Singing in recitative.</i>
talk	Persuade or cause someone to do something by talking. <i>There has been talk about you lately.</i>
transferable	Legally transferable to the ownership of another. <i>Balances are not transferable by cheque.</i>
wrangling	An instance of intense argument (as in bargaining). <i>Weeks of political wrangling.</i>
