## Nonchalantly as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Nonchalantly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “nonchalantly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In a composed and unconcerned manner.*
- *In a casually calm and relaxed manner.*
- *In an unconcerned manner.*

### Synonyms of "Nonchalantly" as an adverb (3 Words)

<b>casually</b>	In a way that lacks sufficient care or thoughtfulness. <i>I wouldn't introduce my family to people I was <b>casually</b> dating.</i>
<b>coolly</b>	In a way that lacks friendliness or enthusiasm. <i>Passengers were able to deal with the possible threat <b>coolly</b> and calmly.</i>
<b>nervelessly</b>	In a composed and unconcerned manner.

### Usage Examples of "Nonchalantly" as an adverb

- *She nonchalantly walked out of the police station.*
- *I shrugged nonchalantly.*

## Associations of "Nonchalantly" (30 Words)

<b>blase</b>	Nonchalantly unconcerned. <i>The <b>blase</b> traveler refers to the ocean he has crossed as the pond.</i>
<b>calm</b>	The absence of strong emotions calm feelings. <i>His voice was <b>calm</b>.</i>
<b>carefree</b>	Cheerfully irresponsible. <i><b>Carefree</b> with his money.</i>
<b>casual</b>	A youth belonging to a subculture characterized by the wearing of expensive casual clothing and frequently associated with football hooliganism. <i>A <b>casual</b> short sleeved shirt.</i>
<b>chilly</b>	Uncomfortably or unpleasantly cold. <i>He got a <b>chilly</b> reception from Republican activists.</i>
<b>composure</b>	The state or feeling of being calm and in control of oneself. <i>He accepted their problems with <b>composure</b> and she with equanimity.</i>
<b>cool</b>	Psychologically cool and unenthusiastic unfriendly or unresponsive or showing dislike. <i>Research for a new drug can cost a <b>cool</b> 50 million.</i>
<b>easy</b>	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>Her <b>easy</b> virtue.</i>
<b>effortless</b>	Not showing effort or strain. <i>Her <b>effortless</b> sense of style.</i>
<b>facile</b>	Performing adroitly and without effort. <i>A man of <b>facile</b> and shallow intellect.</i>
<b>halcyon</b>	A mythical bird said by ancient writers to breed in a nest floating at sea at the winter solstice, charming the wind and waves into calm. <i>A <b>halcyon</b> atmosphere.</i>
<b>happy-go-lucky</b>	Presaging or likely to bring good luck.
<b>indifferent</b>	Neither good nor bad; mediocre. <i>An <b>indifferent</b> chemical in a reaction.</i>
<b>informal</b>	Having or fostering a warm or friendly and informal atmosphere. <i>A relaxed <b>informal</b> manner.</i>
<b>insouciant</b>	Marked by blithe unconcern. <i>An <b>insouciant</b> shrug.</i>
<b>leisurely</b>	Not hurried or forced. <i>Couples strolled <b>leisurely</b> along.</i>

<b>mellow</b>	In a mellow manner. <i>A <b>mellow</b> conversation.</i>
<b>pacify</b>	Fight violence and try to establish peace in (a location). <i>He had to <b>pacify</b> angry spectators.</i>
<b>peaceful</b>	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i><b>Peaceful</b> sleep.</i>
<b>relaxed</b>	(of a muscle or other body part) not tense. <i>We were having a great time and feeling very <b>relaxed</b>.</i>
<u><b>seemingly</b></u>	From appearances alone-Thomas. <i>A <b>seemingly</b> competent and well organized person.</i>
<u><b>serene</b></u>	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. <i>He remained <b>serene</b> in the midst of turbulence.</i>
<b>slack</b>	Slack (lime). <i><b>Slack</b> tides.</i>
<u><b>unconcerned</b></u>	Showing a lack of worry or interest, especially when this is surprising or callous. <i>The prisoner seems entirely <b>unconcerned</b> as to the outcome of the examination.</i>
<u><b>undisturbed</b></u>	Untroubled by interference or disturbance. <i>He could pursue his studies <b>undisturbed</b>.</i>
<b>unflappable</b>	Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. <i>I prided myself on being <b>unflappable</b> even in the most chaotic circumstances.</i>
<b>unhurried</b>	Moving, acting, or taking place without haste or urgency. <i>People strolling about in an <b>unhurried</b> way.</i>
<b>uninterested</b>	Having no care or interest in knowing. <i>She appeared totally <b>uninterested</b>.</i>
<b>unmolested</b>	Not interfered with, disturbed, or harmed. <i>They allowed him to pass <b>unmolested</b>.</i>
<b>untroubled</b>	Free from fear or doubt; easy in mind. <i>A man <b>untroubled</b> by a guilty conscience.</i>
