 In a way that lacks sufficient care or thoughtfulness. *I wouldn t introduce my family to people I was casually dating.* In a way that lacks friendliness or enthusiasm. *Passengers were able to deal with the possible threat coolly and calmly.* nervelessly In a composed and unconcerned manner.

- She nonchalantly walked out of the police station.
- I shrugged nonchalantly.

| <u>blase</u> | Nonchalantly unconcerned. The blase traveler refers to the ocean he has crossed as the pond. |

| calm | The absence of strong emotions calm feelings. <i>His voice was calm</i> . |
| carefree | Cheerfully irresponsible. <i>Carefree</i> with his money. |
| <u>casual</u> | A youth belonging to a subculture characterized by the wearing of expensive casual clothing and frequently associated with football hooliganism. A casual short sleeved shirt. |
| chilly | Uncomfortably or unpleasantly cold. <i>He got a chilly reception from Republican activists.</i> |
| composure | The state or feeling of being calm and in control of oneself. <i>He accepted their problems with</i> composure <i>and she with equanimity.</i> |
| cool | Psychologically cool and unenthusiastic unfriendly or unresponsive or showing dislike. Research for a new drug can cost a cool 50 million. |
| easy | With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>Her</i> easy <i>virtue</i> . |
| effortless | Not showing effort or strain. Her effortless sense of style. |
| <u>facile</u> | Performing adroitly and without effort. A man of facile and shallow intellect. |
| halcyon | A mythical bird said by ancient writers to breed in a nest floating at sea at the winter solstice, charming the wind and waves into calm. A <i>halcyon</i> atmosphere. |
| happy-go-lucky | Presaging or likely to bring good luck. |
| indifferent | Neither good nor bad; mediocre. An indifferent chemical in a reaction. |
| informal | Having or fostering a warm or friendly and informal atmosphere. A relaxed informal manner. |
| insouciant | Marked by blithe unconcern. An insouciant shrug. |
| <u>leisurely</u> | Not hurried or forced. Couples strolled leisurely along. |



| mellow | In a mellow manner. A mellow conversation. |

| pacify | Fight violence and try to establish peace in (a location. <i>He had to pacify angry spectators.</i> |
| peaceful | Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. Peaceful sleep. |
| relaxed | (of a muscle or other body part) not tense. We were having a great time and feeling very relaxed . |
| seemingly | From appearances alone-Thomas. A seemingly competent and well organized person. |
| <u>serene</u> | Not agitated; without losing self-possession. He remained serene in the midst of turbulence. |
| slack | Slake (lime. Slack tides. |
| <u>unconcerned</u> | Showing a lack of worry or interest, especially when this is surprising or callous. The prisoner seems entirely unconcerned as to the outcome of the examination. |
| <u>undisturbed</u> | Untroubled by interference or disturbance. <i>He could pursue his studies undisturbed.</i> |
| unflappable | Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. I prided myself on being unflappable even in the most chaotic circumstances. |
| unhurried | Moving, acting, or taking place without haste or urgency. <i>People strolling about in an unhurried way.</i> |
| uninterested | Having no care or interest in knowing. She appeared totally uninterested . |
| unmolested | Not interfered with, disturbed, or harmed. They allowed him to pass unmolested . |
| untroubled | Free from fear or doubt; easy in mind. A man untroubled by a guilty conscience. |
