- *In an unconcerned manner.*

Synonyms of "Nonchalantly" as an adverb (3 Words)

- casually** In a way that lacks sufficient care or thoughtfulness.
*I wouldn't introduce my family to people I was **casually** dating.*
- coolly** In a way that lacks friendliness or enthusiasm.
*Passengers were able to deal with the possible threat **coolly** and calmly.*
- nervelessly** In a composed and unconcerned manner.

Usage Examples of "Nonchalantly" as an adverb

- *She nonchalantly walked out of the police station.*
- *I shrugged nonchalantly.*

blase	Nonchalantly unconcerned. <i>The blase traveler refers to the ocean he has crossed as the pond.</i>
calm	The absence of strong emotions calm feelings. <i>His voice was calm.</i>
carefree	Cheerfully irresponsible. <i>Carefree with his money.</i>
casual	A youth belonging to a subculture characterized by the wearing of expensive casual clothing and frequently associated with football hooliganism. <i>A casual short sleeved shirt.</i>
chilly	Uncomfortably or unpleasantly cold. <i>He got a chilly reception from Republican activists.</i>
composure	The state or feeling of being calm and in control of oneself. <i>He accepted their problems with composure and she with equanimity.</i>
cool	Psychologically cool and unenthusiastic unfriendly or unresponsive or showing dislike. <i>Research for a new drug can cost a cool 50 million.</i>
easy	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>Her easy virtue.</i>
effortless	Not showing effort or strain. <i>Her effortless sense of style.</i>
facile	Performing adroitly and without effort. <i>A man of facile and shallow intellect.</i>
halcyon	A mythical bird said by ancient writers to breed in a nest floating at sea at the winter solstice, charming the wind and waves into calm. <i>A halcyon atmosphere.</i>
happy-go-lucky	Presaging or likely to bring good luck.
indifferent	Neither good nor bad; mediocre. <i>An indifferent chemical in a reaction.</i>
informal	Having or fostering a warm or friendly and informal atmosphere. <i>A relaxed informal manner.</i>
insouciant	Marked by blithe unconcern. <i>An insouciant shrug.</i>
leisurely	Not hurried or forced. <i>Couples strolled leisurely along.</i>

mellow	In a mellow manner. <i>A mellow conversation.</i>
pacify	Fight violence and try to establish peace in (a location). <i>He had to pacify angry spectators.</i>
peaceful	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>Peaceful sleep.</i>
relaxed	(of a muscle or other body part) not tense. <i>We were having a great time and feeling very relaxed.</i>
<u>seemingly</u>	From appearances alone-Thomas. <i>A seemingly competent and well organized person.</i>
<u>serene</u>	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. <i>He remained serene in the midst of turbulence.</i>
slack	Slake (lime). <i>Slack tides.</i>
<u>unconcerned</u>	Showing a lack of worry or interest, especially when this is surprising or callous. <i>The prisoner seems entirely unconcerned as to the outcome of the examination.</i>
<u>undisturbed</u>	Untroubled by interference or disturbance. <i>He could pursue his studies undisturbed.</i>
unflappable	Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. <i>I prided myself on being unflappable even in the most chaotic circumstances.</i>
unhurried	Moving, acting, or taking place without haste or urgency. <i>People strolling about in an unhurried way.</i>
uninterested	Having no care or interest in knowing. <i>She appeared totally uninterested.</i>
unmolested	Not interfered with, disturbed, or harmed. <i>They allowed him to pass unmolested.</i>
untroubled	Free from fear or doubt; easy in mind. <i>A man untroubled by a guilty conscience.</i>
