## Nonetheless as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Nonetheless" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “nonetheless” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Despite anything to the contrary (usually preceding a concession).*
- *Despite anything to the contrary (usually following a concession).*
- *In spite of that; nevertheless.*

### Synonyms of "Nonetheless" as an adverb (19 Words)

<b>after everything</b>	Behind or in the rear.
<b>all the same</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’.
<b><a href="#">anyhow</a></b>	Used to indicate that a statement explains or supports a previous statement. <i>Two suitcases flung <b>anyhow</b>.</i>

<b>anyway</b>	Used in questions to emphasize the speaker's wish to obtain the truth. <i>Nobody invited Miss Honey to sit down but she sat down <b>anyway</b>.</i>
<b>but</b>	No more than; only. <i>He was a nice bloke <b>but</b>.</i>
<b>even so</b>	Used as an intensive especially to indicate something unexpected.
<b>for all that</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent ('whole' is often used informally for 'wholly').
<b>however</b>	Despite anything to the contrary (usually following a concession). <i><b>However</b> you look at it you can't criticize that.</i>
<b>in any event</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in spite of everything</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in spite of that</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>just the same</b>	And nothing more.
<b>nevertheless</b>	Despite anything to the contrary (usually preceding a concession). <i>While we disliked each other <b>nevertheless</b> we agreed.</i>
<b>notwithstanding</b>	Despite anything to the contrary (usually following a concession). <i>I didn't like it. <b>Notwithstanding</b>, I remained calm.</i>
<b>regardless</b>	Without regard or consideration for. <i>The allowance is paid <b>regardless</b> of age or income.</i>
<b>still</b>	With reference to action or condition; without change, interruption, or cessation. <i>Time stood <b>still</b>.</i>
<b>though</b>	However. <i>I was hunting for work Jobs were scarce <b>though</b>.</i>
<b>withal</b>	All the same; nevertheless (used when adding something that contrasts with a previous comment). <i>She gave him a grateful smile but rueful <b>withal</b>.</i>
<b>yet</b>	From now into the future for a specified length of time. <i>He longed for the flowers that were <b>yet</b> to show themselves.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Nonetheless" as an adverb

- *The rally, which the government had declared illegal, was nonetheless attended by some 6,000.*

## Associations of "Nonetheless" (30 Words)

<b>already</b>	As surprisingly soon or early as this. <i>It was <b>already</b> past four o'clock.</i>
<b>but</b>	(used at the end of a sentence) though; however. <i>He is <b>but</b> a shadow of his former self.</i>
<b><u>complacency</u></b>	A feeling of smug or uncritical satisfaction with oneself or one's achievements. <i>His <b>complacency</b> was absolutely disgusting.</i>
<b>constancy</b>	The tendency for perceived objects to give rise to very similar perceptual experiences in spite of wide variations in the conditions of observation. <i>The <b>constancy</b> of the tradition.</i>
<b><u>despite</u></b>	Contemptuous treatment or behaviour; outrage. <i>The <b>despite</b> in which outsiders were held is legendary.</i>
<b><u>endurance</u></b>	A state of surviving; remaining alive. <i>The marathon tests a runner's <b>endurance</b>.</i>
<b>halting</b>	Fragmentary or halting from emotional strain. <i>Uttered a few <b>halting</b> words of sorrow.</i>
<b>heretofore</b>	Before now. <i>Diseases that <b>heretofore</b> were usually confined to rural areas.</i>
<b>hitherto</b>	Until now or until the point in time under discussion. <i><b>Hitherto</b> part of French West Africa Benin achieved independence in 1960.</i>
<b>however</b>	Despite anything to the contrary (usually preceding a concession). <i>Although I'm a little afraid <b>however</b> I'd like to try it.</i>
<b><u>inaction</u></b>	The state of being inactive. <i>Future generations will condemn us for <b>inaction</b>.</i>
<b>inactivity</b>	Being inactive; being less active. <i>Don't suddenly take up violent exercise after years of <b>inactivity</b>.</i>
<b>lull</b>	A pause during which things are calm or activities are diminished. <i>The rarity of earthquakes there has <b>lulled</b> people into a false sense of security.</i>
<b><u>motionless</u></b>	Not in physical motion. <i>An eagle hung almost <b>motionless</b> close to the ground.</i>
<b><u>nevertheless</u></b>	Despite anything to the contrary (usually preceding a concession). <i>While we disliked each other <b>nevertheless</b> we agreed.</i>

<b>notwithstanding</b>	Despite anything to the contrary (usually following a concession). <i>I didn't like it. <b>Notwithstanding</b>, I remained calm.</i>
<b>preliminary</b>	A preliminary round in a sporting competition. <i>A <b>preliminary</b> draft.</i>
<b>quiescence</b>	A state of quiet (but possibly temporary) inaction. <i>This method has been shown to induce sleep like <b>quiescence</b> in adult animals.</i>
<b>quiescent</b>	Causing no symptoms. <i>The <b>quiescent</b> melancholy of the town.</i>
<b>standing</b>	Executed in or initiated from a standing position. <i>A <b>standing</b> lamp.</i>
<b>static</b>	Relating to statics. <i>The reception was going sour breaking up into <b>static</b>.</i>
<b>statics</b>	The branch of mechanics concerned with bodies at rest and forces in equilibrium.
<b>stationary</b>	Not moving or not intended to be moved. <i>A car collided with a <b>stationary</b> vehicle.</i>
<b>still</b>	A plant and works where alcoholic drinks are made by distillation. <i>The sheriff commanded him to stand <b>still</b> and drop the gun.</i>
<b>though</b>	However (indicating that a factor qualifies or imposes restrictions on what was said previously). <i>I was hunting for work Jobs were scarce <b>though</b>.</i>
<b>tranquilize</b>	Make calm or still.
<b>unchanged</b>	Not changed; unaltered. <i>An <b>unchanged</b> side for tonight s home game.</i>
<b>unformed</b>	Not formed or organized. <i><b>Unformed</b> clay.</i>
<b>unmoving</b>	Not arousing emotions. <i>Claudia sat <b>unmoving</b> behind her desk.</i>
<b>yet</b>	Still; even (used to emphasize increase or repetition). <i>The largest drug bust <b>yet</b>.</i>
