| <b>incessant</b>           | (of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption.<br><i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>   |

| <b>persistent</b>          | Continuing firmly or obstinately in an opinion or course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition.<br><i>The <b>persistent</b> gills of fishes.</i>                                       |
| <b><u>recurrence</u></b>   | The fact of occurring again.<br><i>A drug used to prevent the <b>recurrence</b> of breast cancer.</i>   |
