<u>ceaseless</u>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The fort was subjected to ceaseless bombardment.</i>
changeless	Remaining the same for indefinitely long times. <i>Changeless truths.</i>

<u>consecutive</u>	In a consecutive manner. <i>We numbered the papers consecutively.</i>
constant	Remaining the same over a period of time. <i>A man constant in adherence to his ideals.</i>
<u>continual</u>	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i>Continual is often used interchangeably with continuous.</i>
<u>continuation</u>	The act of continuing an activity without interruption. <i>The government's continuation in office.</i>
continuous	Continuing in time or space without interruption- James Jeans. <i>There are continuous advances in design and production.</i>
endless	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>We smoked endless cigarettes.</i>
<u>ever</u>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Ever the man of action he was impatient with intellectuals.</i>
everlasting	Eternity. <i>The damned would suffer everlasting torment.</i>
fusillade	Attack with fusillade. <i>The Mahdi's adherents fusilladed his palace at Khartoum.</i>
incessant	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>
incessantly	With unflagging resolve. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
<u>lasting</u>	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A lasting relationship.</i>
<u>perennial</u>	A perennial plant. <i>The common buttercup is a popular perennial plant.</i>
perpetual	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>He grows perpetual flowering carnations.</i>
<u>perpetuity</u>	The property of being perpetual (seemingly ceaseless). <i>He did not believe in the perpetuity of military rule.</i>
persistent	Continuing firmly or obstinately in an opinion or course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition. <i>The persistent gills of fishes.</i>
<u>recurrence</u>	The fact of occurring again. <i>A drug used to prevent the recurrence of breast cancer.</i>

recurrent	Occurring often or repeatedly. <i>She had a recurrent dream about falling.</i>
sequential	Forming or following in a logical order or sequence. <i>Sequential processing of data files.</i>
seriatim	Taking one subject after another in regular order; point by point. <i>It is proposed to deal with these matters seriatim.</i>
streak	Cover a surface with streaks. <i>The plane streaked across the sky.</i>
succession	A group of strata representing a single chronological sequence. <i>She had been secretary to a succession of board directors.</i>
successively	In proper order or sequence. <i>Three letters of successively decreasing length.</i>
unceasing	Not coming to an end; continuous. <i>Man's unceasing warfare with drought and isolation.</i>
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
unchanging	Showing little if any change. <i>The party stood for unchanging principles.</i>
uninterrupted	Continuing in time or space without interruption. <i>An uninterrupted flow of traffic.</i>
unremitting	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Unremitting demands of hunger.</i>
