in general

To or toward the inside of.

in the general run of things

To or toward the inside of.

mainly

More than anything else.

*The west will be **mainly** dry.*

more often than not

Used to form the comparative of some adjectives and adverbs.

most of the time

Used to form the superlative.

mostly

Usually; generally.

*I made some good friends but **mostly** met closed minded people.*

naturally

As may be expected.

*He was **naturally** lazy.*

on the whole

To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent ('whole' is often used informally for 'wholly').

ordinarily

Under normal conditions.

*An effort to behave **ordinarily**.*

regularly

On a habitual basis; usually.

*A **regularly** updated news page.*

unremarkably

Under normal conditions.

usually

Under normal conditions.

***Usually** she was late.*

- *Try to breathe normally.*

Without interruption.
*The sun **always** rises in the east.*

broadly

In a wide fashion.
*He interprets the law **broadly**.*

chiefly

Mainly.
*He is remembered **chiefly** for his organ sonatas.*

commonly	Very often; frequently. <i>Shift workers commonly complain of not getting enough sleep.</i>
<u>consist</u>	Be consistent in form tenor or character be congruous. <i>What does love consist in.</i>
customarily	By custom; according to common practice. <i>The leaves are customarily used for animal fodder.</i>
<u>ever</u>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Having to borrow ever larger sums.</i>
exceptionally	To a greater degree than normal; unusually. <i>The court allows half an hour in most cases one hour exceptionally for a very important case.</i>
exponentially	(with reference to an increase) more and more rapidly. <i>Values distributed exponentially according to a given time constant.</i>
<u>general</u>	The general public. <i>Comprehensible to the general reader.</i>
<u>generally</u>	In most cases; usually. <i>The best scheme is generally reckoned to be the Canadian one.</i>
habitually	By way of habit; customarily. <i>He habitually carried a pocket knife.</i>
infrequently	Not often; rarely. <i>A storage area for infrequently used items.</i>
<u>invariably</u>	Without variation or change, in every case. <i>Ranch meals are invariably big and hearty.</i>
<u>largely</u>	To a great extent; on the whole; mostly. <i>These accounts are largely inactive.</i>
<u>mainly</u>	More than anything else. <i>The west will be mainly dry.</i>
<u>mostly</u>	Usually; as a rule. <i>I made some good friends but mostly met closed minded people.</i>
ordinarily	Under normal conditions. <i>An effort to behave ordinarily.</i>
<u>overwhelmingly</u>	Incapable of being resisted. <i>The candy looked overwhelmingly desirable to the dieting man.</i>
pantechnicon	A large moving van (especially one used for moving furniture.
predominantly	Mainly; for the most part. <i>It is predominantly a coastal bird.</i>

primarily

For the most part.

This is **primarily** a question of economics.

principally

For the most part; chiefly.

He was **principally** a landscape painter.

repeatedly

Several time.

They have been warned **repeatedly** with no effect.

routinely

As part of a regular procedure rather than for a special reason.

Owners **routinely** flout local laws about restraining and picking up after their pets.

typically

With the distinctive qualities of a particular type of person or thing.

The illness **typically** lasts five to ten days.

universally

Everywhere.

Progress is not always **universally** welcomed.

usually

Under normal conditions; generally.

Usually she was late.

wont

An established custom.

Constance as was her **wont** had paid her little attention.
