naturally	As may be expected. <i>He was naturally lazy.</i>
on the whole	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’).
ordinarily	Under normal conditions. <i>An effort to behave ordinarily.</i>
regularly	On a habitual basis; usually. <i>A regularly updated news page.</i>
unremarkably	Under normal conditions.
usually	Under normal conditions. <i>Usually she was late.</i>

accepted	Generally believed or recognized to be valid or correct. <i>Several accepted techniques for treating the condition.</i>
always	Without interruption. <i>The sun always rises in the east.</i>
broadly	In a wide fashion. <i>He interprets the law broadly.</i>
chiefly	Mainly. <i>He is remembered chiefly for his organ sonatas.</i>

commonly	Very often; frequently. <i>Shift workers commonly complain of not getting enough sleep.</i>
<u>consist</u>	Be consistent in form tenor or character be congruous. <i>What does love consist in.</i>
customarily	By custom; according to common practice. <i>The leaves are customarily used for animal fodder.</i>

infrequently	Not often; rarely. <i>A storage area for infrequently used items.</i>
<u>invariably</u>	Without variation or change, in every case. <i>Ranch meals are invariably big and hearty.</i>
<u>largely</u>	To a great extent; on the whole; mostly. <i>These accounts are largely inactive.</i>
<u>mainly</u>	More than anything else. <i>The west will be mainly dry.</i>
<u>mostly</u>	Usually; as a rule. <i>I made some good friends but mostly met closed minded people.</i>
ordinarily	Under normal conditions. <i>An effort to behave ordinarily.</i>
<u>overwhelmingly</u>	Incapable of being resisted. <i>The candy looked overwhelmingly desirable to the dieting man.</i>
pantehnicon	A large moving van (especially one used for moving furniture.
predominantly	Mainly; for the most part. <i>It is predominantly a coastal bird.</i>

<u>primarily</u>	For the most part. <i>This is primarily a question of economics.</i>
principally	For the most part; chiefly. <i>He was principally a landscape painter.</i>
repeatedly	Several time. <i>They have been warned repeatedly with no effect.</i>
<u>routinely</u>	As part of a regular procedure rather than for a special reason. <i>Owners routinely flout local laws about restraining and picking up after their pets.</i>
<u>typically</u>	With the distinctive qualities of a particular type of person or thing. <i>The illness typically lasts five to ten days.</i>
universally	Everywhere. <i>Progress is not always universally welcomed.</i>
usually	Under normal conditions; generally. <i>Usually she was late.</i>
<u>wont</u>	An established custom. <i>Constance as was her wont had paid her little attention.</i>
