recollection A thing recollected; a memory.

Used in polite formulas to express apology for or sadness at an

regret occurrence or an inability to accept an invitation.

He had to decline to his regret.

A thing kept or given as a reminder or in commemoration of

remembrance someone.

They exchanged fond **remembrance**s of his gentle ways.



reminiscence A collection in literary form of incidents that someone remembers.

His **reminiscence**s of his early days in Parliament.

sentimentality Exaggerated and self-indulgent tenderness, sadness, or nostalgia.

There are passages which verge on **sentimentality**.

wistfulness A sadly pensive longing.

yearning for the past Prolonged unfulfilled desire or need.

- I was overcome with acute nostalgia for my days at university.
- An evening of TV nostalgia.

despondency Feeling downcast and disheartened and hopeless.

An air of **despondency**.

despondent In low spirits from loss of hope or courage.

Despondent about his failure.

Not up to expectations.

disappointing
The team made a disappointing start.

disappointment A person or thing that causes disappointment.

The job proved a **disappointment**.

dismal Causing a mood of gloom or depression.

His **dismal** mood was not dispelled by finding the house empty.

frustration

An event or circumstance that causes one to feel frustrated.

Her constant complaints were the main source of his **frustration**.

gloom A state of depression or despondency.

A year of economic **gloom** for the car industry.

grief Intense sorrow, especially caused by someone's death.

Her death was a great grief to John.

heartache Intense sorrow caused by loss of a loved one (especially by death.

The familiar pang of **heartache**.

Experiencing a longing for one's home during a period of absence from

homesick it.

He was **homesick** for America after five weeks in Europe.

homesickness A longing to return home.

I lived four years in London without a single pang of homesickness.

hopeless Very bad or incompetent.

I m **hopeless** at names.

In a state of being alone in solitary isolation.

Feelings of depression and **loneliness**.

Prolonged unfulfilled desire or need.

longing
Her longing eyes.

A humor that was once believed to be secreted by the kidneys or spleen

melancholy and to cause sadness and melancholy.

At the centre of his music lies a profound **melancholy** and nostalgia.

State of sorrow over the death or departure of a loved one.

mourningIf he dies she ll put on **mourning** but she won t cry.



An old song, film, or television programme that is still well known or

oldie popular.

Collections of pop **oldies**.

sadness Emotions experienced when not in a state of well-being.

somber Lacking brightness or color; dull.

A **somber** mood.
