## Associations of "Not bad" (30 Words)

<b>barbarous</b>	Able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering. <i>A remote and <b>barbarous</b> country.</i>
<b>beastly</b>	In a beastly manner. <i>This <b>beastly</b> war.</i>
<b>cruel</b>	Spoil or ruin (an opportunity or a chance of success). <i>The winters are long hard and <b>cruel</b>.</i>
<a href="#">decadent</a>	A person who has fallen into a decadent state morally or artistically. <i>I spent a <b>decadent</b> day at a spa.</i>
<a href="#">demon</a>	A powerful, often destructive compulsion or obsession. <i>The <b>demons</b> of injustice bigotry and exploitation.</i>
<a href="#">demonic</a>	Relating to or characteristic of demons or evil spirits. <i>Her laughter was <b>demonic</b>.</i>
<b>deride</b>	Treat or speak of with contempt. <i>He <b>derided</b> his student s attempt to solve the biggest problem in mathematics.</i>
<b>devilry</b>	Reckless or malicious behavior that causes discomfort or annoyance in others. <i>Some <b>devilry</b> was afoot.</i>
<b>diabolic</b>	Showing the cunning or ingenuity or wickedness typical of a devil. <i>Fires lit up a <b>diabolic</b> scene.</i>
<a href="#">diabolical</a>	Characteristic of the Devil, or so evil as to be suggestive of the Devil. <i>A singer with an absolutely <b>diabolical</b> voice.</i>
<a href="#">discredit</a>	Damage the reputation of. <i>Your actions will bring <b>discredit</b> to your name.</i>
<b>disrespect</b>	A manner that is generally disrespectful and contemptuous. <i>A young brave who <b>disrespects</b> his elders.</i>

<b>evil</b>	Of a force or spirit embodying or associated with the forces of the devil. <i>A bathroom with an ineradicably <b>evil</b> smell.</i>
<b>fail</b>	A mistake failure or instance of poor performance. <i>She <b>failed</b> to notice that her child was no longer in his crib.</i>
<b>fiendish</b>	Extremely evil or cruel; expressive of cruelty or befitting hell. <i><b>Fiendish</b> methods of torture.</i>
<b><u>gory</u></b>	Covered in blood. <i>A <b>gory</b> horror film.</i>
<b><u>hellish</u></b>	Extremely (used for emphasis). <i>It had been a <b>hellish</b> week.</i>
<b>horrible</b>	Causing or likely to cause horror; shocking. <i>War is beyond all words <b>horrible</b>.</i>
<b><u>improper</u></b>	Not appropriate for a purpose or occasion. <i>It was considered <b>improper</b> to leave one s house on Christmas Day.</i>
<b>iniquity</b>	Morally objectionable behavior. <i>A den of <b>iniquity</b>.</i>
<b><u>mischief</u></b>	Playfulness that is intended to tease or create trouble. <i>She was bent on making <b>mischief</b>.</i>
<b>rude</b>	Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by simplicity and often crudeness. <i>Isabel had always been in <b>rude</b> health.</i>
<b>rudely</b>	In an offensive or bad-mannered way. <i>He <b>rudely</b> snatched the water pitcher.</i>
<b>unethical</b>	Not conforming to approved standards of social or professional behavior. <i>It is <b>unethical</b> to torment any creature for entertainment.</i>
<b>unfortunately</b>	By bad luck. <i><b>Unfortunately</b> it rained all day.</i>
<b><u>unjust</u></b>	Not equitable or fair. <i>An <b>unjust</b> judge.</i>
<b>vice</b>	Moral weakness. <i>Cigars happen to be my father s <b>vice</b>.</i>
<b>vicious</b>	Deliberately cruel or violent. <i>The dog was <b>vicious</b> and likely to bite.</i>
<b>wicked</b>	Excellent; wonderful. <i>A <b>wicked</b> prank.</i>
<b><u>worse</u></b>	Changed for the worse in health or fitness. <i>He felt <b>worse</b> and groped his way back to bed.</i>
