barbarous	Able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering. <i>A remote and barbarous country.</i>
beastly	In a beastly manner. <i>This beastly war.</i>
cruel	Spoil or ruin (an opportunity or a chance of success). <i>The winters are long hard and cruel.</i>
decadent	A person who has fallen into a decadent state morally or artistically. <i>I spent a decadent day at a spa.</i>
demon	A powerful, often destructive compulsion or obsession. <i>The demons of injustice bigotry and exploitation.</i>
demonic	Relating to or characteristic of demons or evil spirits. <i>Her laughter was demonic.</i>
deride	Treat or speak of with contempt. <i>He derided his student s attempt to solve the biggest problem in mathematics.</i>
devilry	Reckless or malicious behavior that causes discomfort or annoyance in others. <i>Some devilry was afoot.</i>
diabolic	Showing the cunning or ingenuity or wickedness typical of a devil. <i>Fires lit up a diabolic scene.</i>
diabolical	Characteristic of the Devil, or so evil as to be suggestive of the Devil. <i>A singer with an absolutely diabolical voice.</i>
discredit	Damage the reputation of. <i>Your actions will bring discredit to your name.</i>
disrespect	A manner that is generally disrespectful and contemptuous. <i>A young brave who disrespects his elders.</i>

evil	Of a force or spirit embodying or associated with the forces of the devil. <i>A bathroom with an ineradicably evil smell.</i>
fail	A mistake failure or instance of poor performance. <i>She failed to notice that her child was no longer in his crib.</i>
fiendish	Extremely evil or cruel; expressive of cruelty or befitting hell. <i>Fiendish methods of torture.</i>
<u>gory</u>	Covered in blood. <i>A gory horror film.</i>
<u>hellish</u>	Extremely (used for emphasis). <i>It had been a hellish week.</i>
horrible	Causing or likely to cause horror; shocking. <i>War is beyond all words horrible.</i>
<u>improper</u>	Not appropriate for a purpose or occasion. <i>It was considered improper to leave one s house on Christmas Day.</i>
iniquity	Morally objectionable behavior. <i>A den of iniquity.</i>
<u>mischief</u>	Playfulness that is intended to tease or create trouble. <i>She was bent on making mischief.</i>
rude	Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by simplicity and often crudeness. <i>Isabel had always been in rude health.</i>
rudely	In an offensive or bad-mannered way. <i>He rudely snatched the water pitcher.</i>
unethical	Not conforming to approved standards of social or professional behavior. <i>It is unethical to torment any creature for entertainment.</i>
unfortunately	By bad luck. <i>Unfortunately it rained all day.</i>
<u>unjust</u>	Not equitable or fair. <i>An unjust judge.</i>
vice	Moral weakness. <i>Cigars happen to be my father s vice.</i>
vicious	Deliberately cruel or violent. <i>The dog was vicious and likely to bite.</i>
wicked	Excellent; wonderful. <i>A wicked prank.</i>
<u>worse</u>	Changed for the worse in health or fitness. <i>He felt worse and groped his way back to bed.</i>
