## Associations of "Not good enough" (30 Words)

<b>abundantly</b>	In an abundant manner. <i>They were <b>abundantly</b> supplied with food.</i>
<b>adequacy</b>	The state or quality of being adequate. <i>The <b>adequacy</b> of testing procedures.</i>
<b>adequate</b>	Having the requisite qualities or resources to meet a task. <i>This office is perfectly <b>adequate</b> for my needs.</i>
<b><a href="#">alright</a></b>	In a satisfactory or adequate manner alright is a nonstandard variant of all right.
<b>ample</b>	Fairly large. <i>Of <b>ample</b> proportions.</i>
<b>bountiful</b>	Large in quantity; abundant. <i>The ocean provided a <b>bountiful</b> supply of fresh food.</i>
<b>contented</b>	Feeling or expressing happiness or satisfaction. <i>I was never <b>contented</b> with half measures.</i>
<b><a href="#">copious</a></b>	Abundant in supply or quantity. <i><b>Copious</b> provisions.</i>
<b>copiously</b>	In large quantities. <i>I was drinking <b>copiously</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">deserving</a></b>	Worthy of being treated in a particular way (often used ironically). <i>A <b>deserving</b> cause.</i>
<b>exceeding</b>	Extremely exceedingly. <i>An ale of <b>exceeding</b> poor quality.</i>
<b>excellence</b>	An outstanding feature or quality. <i>A centre of academic <b>excellence</b>.</i>
<b>exuberant</b>	Joyously unrestrained. <i><b>Exuberant</b> compliments.</i>

<b>happy</b>	Willing to do something. <i>I m <b>happy</b> with his performance.</i>
<b>indulging</b>	The act of indulging or gratifying a desire.
<b>nice</b>	Pleasant or pleasing or agreeable in nature or appearance. <i>A job requiring <b>nice</b> measurements with a micrometer.</i>
<b>okay</b>	In a satisfactory or adequate manner. <i>She ll do <b>okay</b> on her own.</i>
<b>passable</b>	Able to be passed or traversed or crossed. <i>The road was <b>passable</b> with care.</i>
<b>pleasing</b>	Giving pleasure and satisfaction. <i>A <b>pleasing</b> piece of news.</i>
<b>replete</b>	Fill to satisfaction. <i>I went out into the sun drenched streets again <b>replete</b> and relaxed.</i>
<u><a href="#">sate</a></u>	Satisfied to the full; sated. <i>He folded up his newspaper his curiosity <b>satiated</b>.</i>
<b>satisfaction</b>	What is felt to be owed or due to one, especially in reparation of an injustice or wrong. <i>The <b>satisfaction</b> of their demand for better services.</i>
<u><a href="#">satisfactory</a></u>	Meeting requirements. <i>The verdict is safe and <b>satisfactory</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">sensuous</a></u>	Attractive or gratifying physically, especially sexually. <i>The work showed a deliberate disregard of the more <b>sensuous</b> and immediately appealing aspects of painting.</i>
<u><a href="#">suffice</a></u>	Be sufficient; be adequate, either in quality or quantity. <i>Two examples should <b>suffice</b> to prove the contention.</i>
<b>sufficiency</b>	Self sufficiency or independence of character especially of an arrogant or imperious sort. <i>There is more than a <b>sufficiency</b> of lawyers in this country.</i>
<u><a href="#">sufficient</a></u>	Of a quantity that can fulfill a need or requirement but without being abundant. <i>She had a small private income that was <b>sufficient</b> for her needs.</i>
<u><a href="#">tolerable</a></u>	About average; acceptable. <i>The climate is at least <b>tolerable</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">worthwhile</a></u>	Worth the time, money, or effort spent; of value or importance. <i>This attitude could doom a very <b>worthwhile</b> project to extinction.</i>
