Associations of "Not good enough" (30 Words)

abundantly	In an abundant manner. <i>They were abundantly supplied with food.</i>
adequacy	The state or quality of being adequate. <i>The adequacy of testing procedures.</i>
adequate	Having the requisite qualities or resources to meet a task. <i>This office is perfectly adequate for my needs.</i>
alright	In a satisfactory or adequate manner alright is a nonstandard variant of all right.
ample	Fairly large. <i>Of ample proportions.</i>
bountiful	Large in quantity; abundant. <i>The ocean provided a bountiful supply of fresh food.</i>
contented	Feeling or expressing happiness or satisfaction. <i>I was never contented with half measures.</i>
copious	Abundant in supply or quantity. <i>Copious provisions.</i>
copiously	In large quantities. <i>I was drinking copiously.</i>
deserving	Worthy of being treated in a particular way (often used ironically). <i>A deserving cause.</i>
exceeding	Extremely exceedingly. <i>An ale of exceeding poor quality.</i>
excellence	An outstanding feature or quality. <i>A centre of academic excellence.</i>
exuberant	Joyously unrestrained. <i>Exuberant compliments.</i>

happy	Willing to do something. <i>I m happy with his performance.</i>
indulging	The act of indulging or gratifying a desire.
nice	Pleasant or pleasing or agreeable in nature or appearance. <i>A job requiring nice measurements with a micrometer.</i>
okay	In a satisfactory or adequate manner. <i>She ll do okay on her own.</i>
passable	Able to be passed or traversed or crossed. <i>The road was passable with care.</i>
pleasing	Giving pleasure and satisfaction. <i>A pleasing piece of news.</i>
replete	Fill to satisfaction. <i>I went out into the sun drenched streets again replete and relaxed.</i>
<u>satiated</u>	Satisfied to the full; sated. <i>He folded up his newspaper his curiosity satiated.</i>
satisfaction	What is felt to be owed or due to one, especially in reparation of an injustice or wrong. <i>The satisfaction of their demand for better services.</i>
<u>satisfactory</u>	Meeting requirements. <i>The verdict is safe and satisfactory.</i>
<u>sensuous</u>	Attractive or gratifying physically, especially sexually. <i>The work showed a deliberate disregard of the more sensuous and immediately appealing aspects of painting.</i>
<u>suffice</u>	Be sufficient; be adequate, either in quality or quantity. <i>Two examples should suffice to prove the contention.</i>
sufficiency	Self sufficiency or independence of character especially of an arrogant or imperious sort. <i>There is more than a sufficiency of lawyers in this country.</i>
<u>sufficient</u>	Of a quantity that can fulfill a need or requirement but without being abundant. <i>She had a small private income that was sufficient for her needs.</i>
<u>tolerable</u>	About average; acceptable. <i>The climate is at least tolerable.</i>
<u>worthwhile</u>	Worth the time, money, or effort spent; of value or importance. <i>This attitude could doom a very worthwhile project to extinction.</i>
