<b>awfully</b>	Very much. <i>I m <b>awfully</b> sorry to bother you so late.</i>
<b>clearly</b>	In an easily perceptible manner. <i>Could be seen <b>clearly</b> under the microscope.</i>
<b>conspicuously</b>	In a way that attracts notice or attention. <i>The signs were <b>conspicuously</b> displayed inside the restaurant.</i>
<b>decidedly</b>	In a decisive and confident way. <i>He looked <b>decidedly</b> uncomfortable.</i>
<b>distinctly</b>	To a distinct degree. <i>It s <b>distinctly</b> possible.</i>

<b>especially</b>	To a distinctly greater extent or degree than is common. <i>A new song written <b>especially</b> for Jonathan.</i>
<b>exceptionally</b>	Only in unusual circumstances. <i>The court allows half an hour in most cases one hour <b>exceptionally</b> for a very important case.</i>
<b>extraordinarily</b>	To a remarkable degree; extremely. <i>It is a simple story <b>extraordinarily</b> well told.</i>
<b>extremely</b>	To a very great degree; very. <i><b>Extremely</b> unpleasant.</i>
<b>impressively</b>	In an impressive manner. <i>He has performed <b>impressively</b> in recent games.</i>
<b>in particular</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>incredibly</b>	Not easy to believe. <i>Behind you the coastal hills plunge to the <b>incredibly</b> blue sea backed by the Turkish mountains.</i>
<b>markedly</b>	To an extent which is clearly noticeable; significantly. <i>This advice is <b>markedly</b> different to that last year.</i>
<b>noticeably</b>	In a noticeable manner. <i>After surgery she deteriorated <b>noticeably</b>.</i>
<b>outstandingly</b>	Exceptionally. <i><b>Outstandingly</b> beautiful gardens.</i>
<b>particularly</b>	Uniquely or characteristically. <i>He was <b>particularly</b> fussy about spelling.</i>
<b>peculiarly</b>	More than usually; especially. <i>Under <b>peculiarly</b> tragic circumstances.</i>
<b>plainly</b>	Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly. <i>A light was <b>plainly</b> visible.</i>
<b>primarily</b>	For the most part; mainly. <i>Around 80 per cent of personal computers are used <b>primarily</b> for word processing.</i>
<b>principally</b>	For the most part; chiefly. <i>He was <b>principally</b> a landscape painter.</i>
<b>really</b>	Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is informal. <i>I m sorry Ruth I <b>really</b> am.</i>
<b>remarkably</b>	In a way that is worthy of attention. <i><b>Remarkably</b> she hung on to her job.</i>

<b>signally</b>	As a signal. <i><b>Signally</b> inappropriate methods.</i>
<b>significantly</b>	In a statistically significant way. <i>He paused <b>significantly</b>.</i>
<b>singularly</b>	In a singular manner or to a singular degree. <i>Charlotte thought her very <b>singularly</b> dressed.</i>
<b>especially</b>	For a special purpose. <i>A <b>especially</b> arranged dinner.</i>
<b>spectacularly</b>	In a spectacular manner. <i>A <b>spectacularly</b> stupid idea.</i>
<b>strikingly</b>	In a way that attracts attention by reason of being unusual, extreme, or prominent. <i>A <b>strikingly</b> beautiful girl.</i>
<b>surprisingly</b>	In a way that causes surprise; unexpectedly. <i>He rather <b>surprisingly</b> took up the cause.</i>
<b>terribly</b>	Very; extremely. <i>I m <b>terribly</b> sorry.</i>
<b>unco</b>	To a remarkable degree or extent. <i>It s got an <b>unco</b> fine taste.</i>
<b>uncommonly</b>	Exceptionally; very. <i>He is an <b>uncommonly</b> good talker.</i>
<b>uniquely</b>	So as to be unique. <i>A way of life that was <b>uniquely</b> British.</i>
<b>unusually</b>	To a remarkable or unusual extent; exceptionally. <i>She was <b>unusually</b> tall.</i>
<b>very</b>	Used as intensifiers; `real` is sometimes used informally for `really`; `rattling` is informal. <i>The <b>very</b> best quality.</i>

<b>exceptionally</b>	To a greater degree than normal; unusually. <i>The weather was <b>exceptionally</b> mild for the time of the year.</i>
<b>featured</b>	Made a feature or highlight; given prominence. <i>This blond blue eyed regular <b>featured</b> queen.</i>
<b>flagrant</b>	(of an action considered wrong or immoral) conspicuously or obviously offensive. <i>A <b>flagrant</b> violation of the law.</i>
<b>hallmark</b>	Stamp with a hallmark. <i>The tiny bubbles are the <b>hallmark</b> of fine champagnes.</i>
<b>idiosyncratic</b>	Relating to idiosyncrasy; peculiar or individual. <i>She emerged as one of the great <b>idiosyncratic</b> talents of the nineties.</i>
<b>insofar</b>	To the degree or extent that. <i><b>Insofar</b> as it can be ascertained the horse lung is comparable to that of man.</i>
<b>junction</b>	A place where things join. <i>At such <b>junctions</b> he always had an impulse to leave.</i>
<b>noticed</b>	Being perceived or observed. <i>An easily <b>noticed</b> effect on the rate of growth.</i>

<b>particular</b>	Used to single out an individual member of a specified group or class. <i>Very <b>particular</b> about how her food was prepared.</i>
<b>particularly</b>	To a higher degree than is usual or average. <i>A <b>particularly</b> gruesome attack.</i>
<b>peculiar</b>	Unique or specific to a person or thing or category. <i>Rights <b>peculiar</b> to the rich.</i>
<b>salience</b>	The quality of being particularly noticeable or important; prominence. <i>The political <b>salience</b> of religion has a considerable impact.</i>
<b>selected</b>	Chosen in preference to another.
<b>singularly</b>	In a strange or eccentric way. <i>A <b>singularly</b> unattractive colour.</i>
<b>special</b>	A special offering usually temporary and at a reduced price that is featured in advertising. <i>A <b>special</b> occasion.</i>
<b>specially</b>	To a distinctly greater extent or degree than is common. <i>A <b>specially</b> arranged dinner.</i>
<b>specific</b>	A medicine that has a mitigating effect on a specific disease. <i>The differences between them can only be on the <b>specific</b> level.</i>
